

Compliance

As Special Assistant Auditors for the Auditor General, we have examined the University of Illinois' compliance with the requirements listed below, as more fully described in the Audit Guide for Financial Audits and Compliance Attestation Engagements of Illinois State Agencies (Audit Guide) as adopted by the Auditor General, during the year ended June 30, 2015. The management of the University of Illinois (the University) is responsible for compliance with these requirements. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the University's compliance based on our examination.

- A. The University has obligated, expended, received, and used public funds of the State in accordance with the purpose for which such funds have been appropriated or otherwise authorized by law.
- B. The University has obligated, expended, received, and used public funds of the State in accordance with any limitations, restrictions, conditions or mandatory directions imposed by law upon such obligation, expenditure, receipt or use.
- C. The University has complied, in all material respects, with applicable laws and regulations, including the State uniform accounting system, in its financial and fiscal operations.
- D. State revenues and receipts collected by the University are in accordance with applicable laws and regulations and the accounting and recordkeeping of such revenues and receipts is fair, accurate and in accordance with law.
- E. Money or negotiable securities or similar assets handled by the University on behalf of the State or held in trust by the University have been properly and legally administered and the accounting and recordkeeping relating thereto is proper, accurate, and in accordance with law.

Our examination was conducted in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants; the standards applicable to attestation engagements contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; the Illinois State Auditing Act (Act); and the Audit Guide as adopted by the Auditor General pursuant to the Act; and, accordingly, included examining, on a test basis, evidence about the University's compliance with those requirements listed in the first paragraph of this report and performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances. We believe that our examination provides a reasonable basis for our opinion. Our examination does not provide a legal determination on the University's compliance with specified requirements.

In our opinion, the University complied, in all material respects, with the compliance requirements listed in the first paragraph of this report during the year ended June 30, 2015. However, the results of our procedures disclosed instances of noncompliance with the requirements, which are required to be reported in accordance with criteria established by the Audit Guide, issued by the Illinois Office of the Auditor General and which are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as items 2015-001 through 2015-003, and 2015-020 through 2015-030. As required by the Audit Guide, immaterial findings relating to instances of noncompliance excluded from this report have been reported in a separate letter to your office.

Internal Control

Management of the University is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective internal control over compliance with the requirements listed in the first paragraph of this report. In planning and performing our examination, we considered the University's internal control over compliance with the requirements listed in the first paragraph of this report to determine the examination procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinion on compliance and to test and report on internal control over compliance in accordance with the Audit Guide, issued by the Illinois Office of the Auditor General, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control over compliance. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control over compliance.

A deficiency in internal control over compliance exists when the design or operation of a control over compliance does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, noncompliance with the requirements listed in the first paragraph of this report on a timely basis. *A material weakness in internal control over compliance* is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance, such that there is a reasonable possibility that material noncompliance with a requirement listed in the first paragraph of this report will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. *A significant deficiency in internal control over compliance* is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance that is less severe than a material weakness in internal control over compliance, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control over compliance was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control over compliance that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies and therefore, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may exist that were not identified. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over compliance that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, we identified certain deficiencies in internal control over compliance, as described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as items 2015-001 through 2015-003, and 2015-020 through 2015-030, that we consider to be significant deficiencies.

As required by the Audit Guide, immaterial findings excluded from this report have been reported in a separate letter to your office.

The University's responses to the findings identified in our examination are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs. We did not examine the University's responses and, accordingly, we express no opinion on the responses.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Auditor General, the General Assembly, the Legislative Audit Commission, the Governor, University management, the Board of Trustees of the University, others within the University, and federal awarding agencies and pass-through entities and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.

As Special Assistant Auditors for the Auditor General, we have audited, in accordance with the auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, the financial statements of the business-type activities of University of Illinois and the aggregate discretely presented component units, collectively a component unit of the State of Illinois, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2015, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the University of Illinois' basic financial statements, and have issued our report thereon dated December 23, 2015.

Our report includes a reference to other auditors who audited the financial statements of the discretely presented component units, as described in our report on the University's financial statements. Other auditors audited the financial statements of the University of Illinois Foundation (a discretely presented component unit) in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, as described in our report on the University's financial statements. This report does not include the results of the other auditors' testing of internal control over financial reporting or compliance and other matters that are reported on separately by those auditors. The financial statements of the University of Illinois Alumni Association; Wolcott, Wood, and Taylor, Inc.; Prairieland Energy, Inc.; Illinois Ventures, LLC; the University Research Park, LLC; and UI Singapore Research, LLC (all discretely presented component units), were not audited in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* and accordingly this report does not include reporting on internal control over financial reporting or instances of reportable noncompliance with those entities.

Internal Control Over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements, we considered the University of Illinois' internal control over financial reporting (internal control) to determine the audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the University of Illinois' internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the University of Illinois' internal control.

A *deficiency in internal control* exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A *material weakness* is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. A *significant deficiency* is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. Given these limitations, during our audit we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, we identified certain deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting, described in the accompanying schedule of findings as items 2015-001, 2015-002, and 2015-003 that we consider to be significant deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged governance.

Compliance and Other Matters

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the University of Illinois' financial statements are free from material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit and, accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

University of Illinois' Response to Findings

The University of Illinois' response to the findings identified in our audit is described in the accompanying schedule of findings. The University of Illinois' responses were not subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and, accordingly, we express no opinion on them.

Purpose of this Report

The purpose of this report is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control and compliance and the result of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of the University of Illinois' internal control or on compliance. This report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering the University of Illinois' internal control and compliance. Accordingly, this communication is not suitable for any other purpose.

Report on Compliance for Each Major Federal Program

We have audited the University of Illinois' (the University) compliance with the types of compliance requirements described in the *U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular A-133 Compliance Supplement* that could have a direct and material effect on each of the University's major federal programs for the year ended June 30, 2015. The University's major federal programs are identified in the summary of auditor's results section of the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs.

The schedule of expenditures of federal awards and our audit described below does not include expenditures of federal awards for those agencies determined to be component units of the University for financial statement purposes.

Management's Responsibility

Management is responsible for compliance with the requirements of laws, regulations, contracts, and grants applicable to its federal programs.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on compliance for each of the University's major federal programs based on our audit of the types of compliance requirements referred to above. We conducted our audit of compliance in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America; the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; and OMB Circular A-133, *Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations*. Those standards and OMB Circular A-133 require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether noncompliance with the types of compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on a major federal program occurred. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence about the University's compliance with those requirements and performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion on compliance for each major federal program. However, our audit does not provide a legal determination of the University's compliance.

Opinion on Each Major Federal Program

In our opinion, the University complied, in all material respects, with the types of compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on each of its major federal programs for the year ended June 30, 2015.

Other Matters

The results of our auditing procedures disclosed instances of noncompliance, which are required to be reported in accordance with OMB Circular A-133 and which are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as items 2015-004 through 2015-019. Our opinion on each major federal program is not modified with respect to these matters.

The University's responses to the noncompliance findings identified in our audit are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs. The University's responses were not subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of compliance and, accordingly, we express no opinion on the responses.

Report on Internal Control over Compliance

Management of the University is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective internal control over compliance with the types of compliance requirements referred to above. In planning and performing our audit of compliance, we considered the University's internal control over compliance with the types of requirements that could have a direct and material effect on each major federal program to determine the auditing procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing an opinion on compliance for each major federal program and to test and report on internal control over compliance in accordance with OMB Circular A-133, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of internal control over compliance. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the University's internal control over compliance.

A deficiency in internal control over compliance exists when the design or operation of a control over compliance does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program on a timely basis. *A material weakness in internal control over compliance* is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance, such that there is a reasonable possibility that material noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. *A significant deficiency in internal control over compliance* is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program that is less severe than a material weakness in internal control over compliance, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control over compliance was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control over compliance that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies and therefore, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may exist that were not identified. We identified certain deficiencies in internal control over compliance, as described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as items 2015-004 through 2015-010 that we consider to be material weaknesses. We identified certain deficiencies in internal control over compliance, as described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as items 2015-011 through 2015-019, that we consider to be significant deficiencies.

The University's responses to the internal control over compliance findings identified in our audit are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs. The University's responses were not subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of compliance and, accordingly, we express no opinion on the responses.

The purpose of this report on internal control over compliance is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over compliance and the results of that testing based on the requirements of OMB Circular A-133. Accordingly, this report is not suitable for any other purpose.

Report on Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards Required by OMB Circular A-133

We have audited the financial statements of, the business-type activities and the aggregate discretely presented component units of University of Illinois, a component unit of the State of Illinois, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2015, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise University of Illinois' basic financial statements. We issued our report thereon dated December 23, 2015, which contained unmodified opinions on those financial statements. Our report was modified to include a reference to other auditors and to include an emphasis of matter paragraph stating the University adopted GASB Statement No. 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, and the related GASB Statement No. 71, Pension Transition for Contributions Made Subsequent to the Measurement Date – an amendment of GASB Statement No. 68. Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the basic financial statements. The accompanying schedule of expenditures of federal awards is presented for purposes of additional analysis as required by OMB Circular A-133 and is not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements or to the basic financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the schedule of expenditure of federal awards is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements as a whole.

2015-001. Finding: Inadequate Procedures over Expense Deferrals and Other Cut-off Related Issues

The University of Illinois (the University) has not established adequate internal controls over accurately identifying and recording deferred expense transactions and reporting prepaid expenses at fiscal year-end for financial reporting purposes.

During our audit, we noted that the University's procedures to identify and record prepaid expenses include a review of all cash disbursements by University Payables (UPAY). UPAY identifies expense transactions that pertain to multiple fiscal years and code them for further review by University Accounting and Financial Reporting (UAFR). UAFR will then post year end journal entries to appropriately defer the identified expense transactions. In addition to the review of all cash disbursements by UPAY, UAFR also requires individual units to identify and report known accrual and deferral transactions at fiscal year-end for certain fund types. We also noted that the University's year-end accounts payable procedures include specifically reviewing cash disbursements made subsequent to year-end through the end of October to determine which accounting period the related expense transactions pertain.

In relation to our test work over expense transactions, we reviewed 197 cash disbursement transactions (totaling \$42,171,231), 67 P-Card expense transactions (totaling \$247,947), and 60 T-Card expense transactions (totaling \$239,444) recorded during the fiscal year. We also reviewed 11 cash disbursements occurring subsequent to year-end (totaling \$24,827,569). Additionally, we separately reviewed 12 internal journal voucher transactions recorded during the fiscal year (totaling \$13,894,968 debits and \$16,297,995 credits).

In relation to our test work over revenue transactions, we reviewed 60 cash receipt transactions recorded during the fiscal year (totaling \$216,289,228).

During our review of these transactions, we noted the following items were not recorded in the proper accounting period:

University of Illinois transactions

- One (1) general expense cash disbursement (totaling \$5,682) that was recorded as expense for fiscal year ended June 30, 2015, should have been partially accrued as of June 30, 2014 at an amount of \$1,218.
- One (1) general expense cash disbursement (totaling \$68,175) that was recorded as expense for fiscal year ended June 30, 2015, should have been partially deferred as of June 30, 2015 at an amount of \$34,088, and then recognized as expense for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.
- One (1) cash receipt (totaling \$272,051) that was recorded as operating revenue for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2015, should have been partially deferred as of June 30, 2015 at an amount of \$181,864, and then recognized as operating revenue for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

University of Illinois P-card transactions

- One (1) service expense cash disbursement (totaling \$3,931) that was recorded as an expense for fiscal year ended June 30, 2015, should have been deferred as of June 30, 2015, and then recognized as expenses for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2016 and June 30, 2017 at an amount of \$2,016 and \$1,915, respectively.

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Year Ended June 30, 2015**

- Two (2) general and service expenses cash disbursements (totaling \$9,817) that were recorded as expenses for fiscal year ended June 30, 2015, should have been partially deferred as of June 30, 2015 at an amount of \$9,514, and then recognized as expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

University of Illinois T-card transactions

- One (1) general expense cash disbursement (totaling \$2,307) that was recorded as an expense for fiscal year ended June 30, 2015, should have been accrued as of June 30, 2014.
- One (1) general expense cash disbursement (totaling \$5,209) that was recorded as an expense for fiscal year ended June 30, 2015, should have been deferred as of June 30, 2015, and then recognized as expense for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

Generally accepted accounting principles require transactions to be reported in the period they are incurred. Additionally, the Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (30 ILCS 10/3001), requires the University to establish and maintain a system, or systems, of internal fiscal and administrative controls, which shall provide assurance that: (1) resources are utilized efficiently, effectively, and in compliance with applicable law; (2) obligations and costs are in compliance with applicable law; (3) funds, property, and other assets and resources are safeguarded against waste, loss, unauthorized use, and misappropriation; (4) revenues, expenditures, and transfers of assets, resources, or funds applicable to operations are properly recorded and accounted for to permit the preparation of accounts and reliable financial and statistical reports and to maintain accountability over the State's resources; and (5) funds held outside the State Treasury are managed, used, and obtained in strict accordance with the terms of their enabling authorities and that no unauthorized funds exist. The University's system of internal controls should include procedures to ensure expenses and revenues are recognized in the appropriate reporting period.

In discussing these conditions with University personnel, they stated that the units associated with the exceptions did not adequately follow the procedures to record the transactions in the proper period. While the University believes it has processes in place to prevent material misstatements in the financial statements, the highly decentralized business environment with hundreds of units and large volumes of transactions does present challenges to catching all errors.

Failure to accurately analyze and record cash disbursements within the proper fiscal year may result in the misstatement of the University's financial statements. (Finding Code 2015-001, 2014-001, 2013-001, 12-01, 11-01, 10-03, 09-03)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University continue to review its process to assess the existence of current period expenses and consider changes necessary to ensure prepaid expenses are accurately identified and recorded for presentation in the University's financial statements.

University Response:

Accepted. The University will continue to implement corrective actions to address the recommendation in this finding.

2015-002. Finding: Inadequate Controls Over University Procurement Card Transactions

The University of Illinois (the University) has not established adequate internal controls over procurement card transactions.

The University operates a procurement card program which allows individuals throughout the University to make smaller purchases (defined as less than \$4,999) on a credit card which is directly paid by the University on a monthly basis. The University's policies require employees assigned a procurement card to complete training on policies and procedures, pass a test, and sign an agreement stipulating they will use the card in accordance with University policy. This agreement is also required to be authorized by the individual's supervisor or the department head. The University's policies require transactions incurred on the procurement card to be approved in the University's procurement card system by the individual cardholder and an assigned reviewer.

During our test work over 67 procurement card transactions totaling \$247,947, we noted the following:

- Two transactions (totaling \$3,298) were for charges prohibited by the University's procurement card policies.
- One transaction (totaling \$4,968) was for a graduate student's tuition and fees which did not follow the University's Office of Business and Financial Services policies and procedures for graduate student tuition and fees departmental payments which resulted in an erroneous refund totaling \$4,968 to the student's account which was subsequently disbursed to the student.
- Three transactions (totaling \$9,649) were for a graduate student's tuition and fees which did not follow the University's Office of Business and Financial Services policies and procedures for graduate student tuition and fees departmental payments which resulted in the transactions not being properly processed by the University's Payroll & Benefits department which determines the taxability of waivers.
- One purchase (totaling \$12,192) was paid in two or more installments (3 transactions each for \$4,064), circumventing the card holder's single transaction limit of \$4,999.
- One transaction (totaling \$5,785) exceeded the card holder's single transaction limit of \$4,999, and the purchase was made prior to the approval of P-card Exception Request. The exception request was approved 23 days late.
- One transaction (totaling \$71) included a charge of \$4 for sales tax which is a prohibited charge because the University is tax-exempt.
- Three transactions for printing services (totaling \$460) were not in compliance with the Illinois Procurement Code and the waiver for this requirement was not obtained from the State Purchasing Officer.

The University has approximately 4,315 active procurement cards and the procurement card expenditures paid for the year ended June 30, 2015 totaled \$58,780,227.

The University policy states that all P-Card exception requests must be submitted to UPAY Card Services using the P-Card Exception Request. Based on the exception criteria, UPAY Card Services routes the request to the appropriate unit(s) or employee(s) for review, and notifies the requester via email of the approval or denial of the request. Exceptions must be approved prior to making the requested purchase(s).

The Illinois Procurement Code (30 ILCS 500/45-15) states that contracts requiring the procurement of printing services shall specify the use of soybean oil-based ink unless a State purchasing officer determines that another type of ink is required to assure high quality and reasonable pricing of the printed product.

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Under Internal Revenue Code Section 127, employers may provide employees graduate tuition and fee waivers up to \$5,250 per calendar year that are excludable from taxable income. The University's Office of Student Financial Aid is responsible for processing the waivers for which the University Payroll & Benefits department determines the taxability of waivers exceeding \$5,250, notifies employees of the required taxation, and withholds the applicable taxes from the employees' compensation. To ensure proper taxation, the University's Office of Business and Financial Services procedures require departments to complete the Student Account Payment Request Form to request payment for all graduate-level tuition and fees.

Moreover, the Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (30 ILCS 10/3001) requires the University to establish and maintain a system or systems of internal fiscal and administrative controls, which shall provide assurance that: (1) resources are utilized effectively, and in compliance with applicable law (2) obligations and cost are in compliance with applicable law; (3) funds, property, and other assets and resources are safeguarded against waste, loss, unauthorized use, and misappropriation; (4) revenues, expenditures, and transfers of assets, resources or funds applicable to operations are properly recorded and accounted for to permit preparation of accounts and reliable financial and statistical reports and to maintain accountability over the State's resources; and (5) funds held outside the State Treasury are managed, used, and obtained in strict accordance with the terms of their enabling authorities and that no unauthorized funds exist. The University's system of internal controls should include procedures to ensure procurement card transactions are in accordance with University policies and procedures and supporting documentation for each transaction is maintained.

University officials stated the bulleted exceptions largely resulted from human error. In addition, management indicated the 3 exceptions related to the Soybean Oil-Based Ink Act are the result of challenges in understanding how to apply the applicable state statutes. 50 ILCS 520/10 gives state agencies flexibility in determining the type of ink to assure reasonable pricing and high quality of the printed product, while 30 ILCS 500/45-15 requires non-soybean oil-based ink to be approved by the State Purchasing Officer.

Failure to properly review and approve procurement card transactions could result in erroneous or fraudulent transactions being recorded in the general ledger system and results in noncompliance with Internal Revenue Code and the University's Office of Business and Financial Services policies and procedures. (Finding Code 2015-002, 2014-002, 2013-002, 12-02, 11-03, 10-02, 09-02, and 08-03)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University continue to review and improve its internal controls over procurement card transactions to ensure that erroneous or fraudulent transactions are not recorded in the general ledger system and to ensure compliance with Internal Revenue Code.

University Response:

Accepted. The University recognizes the importance of process controls, training, and transaction monitoring in this area. Further corrective action will be taken in connection with the recommendation in this finding.

2015-003. Finding: Inadequate Controls Over Monitoring External Audits, Attestation Engagements and Other Studies

The University has not established adequate internal controls over monitoring external audits, attestation engagements and other studies.

The University's system of internal controls over monitoring external audits, attestation engagements and studies are inadequate as there are currently no policies or procedures requiring central monitoring to ensure all identified risks and deficiencies are adequately assessed and addressed at a University wide level.

Monitoring all external audits, attestation engagements, and other studies at a central, University wide level is important to the overall system of internal controls to ensure the University is adequately addressing all potential risks and implementing proper corrective action plans to address risks. Centralized procedures to monitor external audits should be performed by the University.

Moreover, the Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (30 ILCS 10/3001) requires the University to establish and maintain a system, or systems, of internal fiscal and administrative controls, which shall provide assurance that: (1) resources are utilized effectively, and in compliance with applicable law (2) obligations and cost are in compliance with applicable law; (3) funds, property, and other assets and resources are safeguarded against waste, loss, unauthorized use, and misappropriation; (4) revenues, expenditures, and transfers of assets, resources or funds applicable to operations are properly recorded and accounted for to permit preparation of accounts and reliable financial and statistical reports and to maintain accountability over the State's resources; and (5) funds held outside the State Treasury are managed, used, and obtained in strict accordance with the terms of their enabling authorities and that no unauthorized funds exist. The University's system of internal controls should include policies and procedures to ensure the University is adequately addressing all potential risks and implementing proper corrective action plans to address risks.

The University indicated that its central offices normally become aware of external audits, attestation engagements and other studies that identify internal control weaknesses, as such activities typically involve research grants/contracts and other areas overseen by the University's central offices. As such, the University believed that identified internal control weaknesses would typically receive the necessary corrective action and financial reporting consideration. Nevertheless, formal policies and structures had not existed to specifically require that all such engagements/studies to be reported/monitored, centrally.

The possibility exists under the University's current policies and procedures for monitoring external audits, attestation engagements and other studies that a risk or internal control deficiency identified during the audit or attestation process would not be adequately communicated at a University wide level allowing the University's financial reporting department to assess whether there are any potential risks at a University and financial reporting level.

Failure to implement the appropriate internal controls to monitor all external audits, attestation engagements, and other studies at a central, University wide level may result in non-compliance with applicable laws and regulations. (Finding Code 2015-003)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University review and implement stronger internal controls in order to ensure the University remains in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations.

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Year Ended June 30, 2015**

University Response:

Accepted. The University will take the necessary corrective action to address the recommendation in this finding.

2015-004. Finding: Incomplete Documentation in Client Eligibility Files

The University of Illinois did not perform eligibility determinations for beneficiaries of the Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCH Block Grant) program in accordance with the Illinois Division for Specialized Care for Children (DSCC).

MCH Block Grant funds are used to provide care to special needs children who meet a variety of program eligibility requirements which include medical, financial and other general criteria. During our testing for 60 beneficiary payments disbursed totaling \$59,943 under the MCH Block Grant we noted two beneficiary files with incorrect or incomplete financial eligibility determination information.

- In the first case, the adjusted gross income (AGI) was incorrectly used from the legally responsible adult's (LRA) most recent tax information to determine financial eligibility. Program regulations require financial eligibility to be based on family size and the family's annual total income. The family size and annual total income is placed on the Financial Eligibility Scale to determine if the beneficiary is eligible to receive financial assistance. It was noted that the AGI, rather than the annual total income, was incorrectly used on the Financial Eligibility Scale to determine eligibility. In this case, the applicant is not eligible to receive financial assistance from the MCH Block Grant funds due to the total annual income in excess of the allowable amount on the Financial Eligibility Scale. The use of the incorrect income level from the tax return resulted in a financially ineligible LRA (89 Illinois Administrative Code 1200.50 (c)(4)(A)). The beneficiary payment amount of \$786 was paid for the financially ineligible applicant.
- In the other case, sufficient documentation was not included to support total family income. Program regulations require the income utilized to determine eligibility to be comprised of wages of a family's annual total income as the sum of all income of the persons comprising the family unit. (89 Illinois Administrative Code 1200.50 (d)(2)). The family size was properly determined as three; the LRA, the LRA's spouse, and the recipient child. The LRA's annual income was the only income used to determine financial eligibility. It was noted the annual income of the LRA's spouse was provided with the application, but not used to determine eligibility.

According to the Illinois Administrative Code (Code) (89 Ill. Admin. Code 1200.50 (c)(4)(A))states that financial assistance is provided when the total family income is equal to or less than the income allowable according to the Financial Eligibility Scale. The Financial Eligibility Scale represents 285% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines published yearly by the Department of Health And Human Services (89 Ill. Admin. Code 1200.50 (c)(2)).

Additionally, the Code (89 Ill. Admin. Code 1200.50 (d)(2)) states a family's annual total income shall be the sum of all income of persons comprising the family unit, as determined by the sum of the number of persons in each of the following categories:

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Year Ended June 30, 2015**

- i. The applicant or recipient child;
- ii. The applicant or recipient child's spouse;
- iii. A Legally Responsible Adult (LRA) and his/her spouse; and
- iv. Other persons, who, for federal income tax purposes, are deemed dependents of the applying LRA.

OMB Circular A-110 requires nonfederal entities receiving Federal awards establish and maintain internal controls designed to reasonably ensure compliance with Federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure that the eligibility of beneficiaries is properly determined and documentation is maintained to support the determination review.

In discussing this condition with University officials, they stated the differences were a result of human error.

Failure to perform eligibility determinations in accordance with the program regulation may result in ineligible beneficiaries receiving services for which they are not eligible. (Finding Code No. 2015-004, 2014-004, 2013-003, 12-03, 11-06)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University review current procedures for performing eligibility determination in accordance with program regulations and implement any changes necessary to ensure proper documentation is used to determine program eligibility.

University Response:

Accepted.

For the first case cited above, the preparer inadvertently picked up the Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) instead of the Total Income line on the tax return to determine financial eligibility, which are often identical on applications. One payment was made on behalf of this recipient in fiscal year 2015 totaling \$786, which has been removed from the award.

In the second case noted above, the tax return was filed with a status of single for the mother, however, the couple had married since the time of the tax return filing. The reviewer noted seeing the father's tax return for eligibility calculation purposes, but missed entering the information into the system at the time. The applicant's eligibility was recalculated using both the mother and father's annual income and the family remains eligible for the program.

2015-005. Finding: Inadequate Procedures for Closing out Federal Projects

The University does not have adequate procedures in place to ensure federal projects are closed in a timely manner.

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Year Ended June 30, 2015**

The University administers thousands of individual federal projects from several federal agencies and pass-through entities which have varying project periods. The University has formally documented policies and procedures for closing out federally funded projects which generally require projects to be closed within 90 days after the project end date. Procedures have been established to send a notice of terminating accounts to the principal investigator or program coordinator 90 days prior to the project end date. The notice provides information about the process for closing projects and includes an information request for any extensions granted and other project information necessary to complete the project close out. Personnel in the Grants and Contracts Office are responsible for ensuring the University has met its obligations under the project, closing the general ledger accounts, and returning any unexpended grants funds to the federal agency or pass-through entity.

During our review of the University's schedule of expenditures of federal awards for the year ended June 30, 2015, we noted expenditures (or negative expenditures) were reported for several projects with end dates of greater than the 90 day close out period. Specifically, we noted the following:

Upon review of the transactions recorded in the projects above, we noted that transactions included a number of transfer expenditures and corrections. Periodic financial reports previously submitted for several of the University's federally funded projects inaccurately included or excluded project expenditures which have later been corrected.

OMB Circular A-110, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations (OMB Circular A-110) requires accurate, current and complete disclosure of the financial results of each federally sponsored project or program in accordance with the applicable reporting criteria. Under OMB guidance, per 2 CFR, Chapter 11 Section 200.343(a) requires that the non-Federal entity must submit, no later than 90 calendar days after the end of the period of performance, all financial, performance and other reports as required by or the terms and conditions of the Federal award. The Federal awarding agency or pass-through entity may approve extensions when requested by the non-Federal entity. OMB Circular A-110 also requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure expenditures are allowable in accordance with federal regulations.

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In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated there are a variety of reasons for delays in grant close-outs.

Failure to close projects and process necessary cost transfers in a timely manner may result in inaccurate periodic financial reports and unallowable costs. (Finding Code No. 2015-005, 2014-005, 2013-005, 12-04, 11-07, 10-11, 09-13)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University review its current close out procedures and implement additional procedures to monitor the timeliness of federal account close outs.

University Response:

Accepted.

The University agrees that projects were not always closed within 90 days. The University does have adequate procedures in place, and on-going efforts are underway to improve the closeout process. In the instances of late award closeout, the reason for the delay varies from award to award. Difficulties in collecting delinquent Accounts Receivable balances or completion of project deliverables have contributed to late award closeout. Additionally, some awards may remain open more than 90 days after the end date as the University awaits continuation paperwork for incrementally funded awards. We do believe that we have effective internal controls to ensure that expenditures are allowable in accordance with federal regulations. While the thorough closeout process ensures the appropriateness of the charges, it also lengthens the closeout time.

The University continues to make progress in the closeout of expired sponsored projects. Of the 259 projects cited above, 119 of 138 UIUC projects, 111 of 120 UIC projects and 1 of 1 UIS projects have been successfully closed to date.

Below are some additional details related to the delay in closing the cited projects:

UIUC Response

UIUC reopened awards formerly closed based on a University decision to remove and refund costs of services subsequently found to be not adequately substantiated. This increased the number of transactions cited above. The University also completed a detailed review of older awards that were determined to be uncollectible. Those are included in the transaction numbers above, but have been closed as well.

UIC Response

One of UIC's awards for late closeout remains open due to a last minute decision from the sponsor not to grant an extension. In this instance, the charges incurred in good faith during the anticipated extension period were removed from the award and the University is awaiting payment of final invoice. Closeout of this award will occur once payment has been received.

2015-006. Finding: Incomplete Cost Transfer Information

The University does not adequately document cost transfers for the Research and Development agricultural grant (Hatch Grant) and Cooperative Extension Services programs.

The University lacks formal policies and procedures for the Federal Agriculture Funds and does not prepare cost transfer forms for any appropriations received under the Research and Development Cluster (Hatch Grant) and Cooperative Extension Services programs.

During our testing of 60 Research and Development cost transfers totaling \$441,476 (all positive), we noted a cost transfer under the Hatch Grant where cost transfer forms were not prepared.

During our testing of 60 Cooperative Extension Services cost transfers totaling \$100,697 positive cost transfers and \$(13,645) negative cost transfers, we noted five cost transfers where cost transfer forms were not prepared.

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OMB Circular A-21, Cost Principles for Higher Education Institutions, establishes principles and standards for determining costs for federal awards carried out through grants, cost reimbursements contracts, and other agreements with higher education institutions. To be allowable under federal awards, costs must meet certain general criteria. Those criteria, amount other things, require that the expenditures must be allocable, reasonable, and supported by adequate documentation.

OMB Circular A-110, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations (OMB Circular A-110) requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonable ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure expenditures (including cost transfers) are adequately documented in accordance with federal regulations and University policy at the time the transfer is made.

The University is responsible for maintaining a policy to document the processing of cost transfers.

The University stated that forms were not done because they were not required by the current policy.

Failure to maintain a policy to adequately document cost transfers may result in unallowable costs being transferred to federal programs. (Finding Code No. 2015-006, 2014-006, 2013-006)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University review its policies related to documentation and approval of cost transfers and implement procedures to ensure the University cost transfer policies are being adequately followed for all federal funds including agricultural grant funds (Hatch grant) and Cooperative Extension Services grant funds.

University Response:

Accepted.

The cost transfer forms cited as missing are required for sponsored projects administered at the Office of Grants and Contracts. The Federal Agriculture Appropriation Capacity Funds are administered at the College of Agriculture, Consumer and Environmental Sciences. There is no requirement for the forms cited in the finding, however, the University will review its policies related to documentation and approval of cost transfers and implement procedures to ensure that cost transfers are being adequately documented by Hatch Capacity Funds and Cooperative Extension Services Smith-Lever Capacity Funds.

2015-007. Finding: Inadequate Approval Controls over Financial Reporting

The University does not adequately document the performance of supervisory reviews of financial reports submitted for its federal programs.

During our testwork of 40 Research and Development Cluster SF-425 reports (12 quarterly reports, 14 annual reports, and one final report), 1 annual SF-424 report, 8 monthly reports and 4 ACM\$ reports we noted the following:

- Four annual Federal Financial Reports were submitted without evidence of a review of the report. In two of these instances, the report was completed and reconciled to the Banner Financial System as required by the Circulars by the NIH Assistant Director, and submitted through the NIH Commons online system for CFDA No. 93.859.

In the other two instances, we were unable to determine whether an individual other than the preparer reviewed the report for CFDA Nos. 16.560 and 17.720.

- Two Federal Financial Reports, one SF424 report, and one monthly financial status report were submitted after the required filing dates. These related to CFDA Nos. 14.906; 17.720; 84.305; 77.000, respectively.

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OMB Circular A-110, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations (OMB Circular A-110) requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include a documented supervisory review to ensure the accuracy of all financial reports submitted to the federal agencies.

In discussing this condition with University officials, they stated there are various reasons for the errors and that there is no specific requirement for documentation of a supervisory review.

Failure to perform supervisory reviews of financial reports may result in the submission of inaccurate reports which would inhibit the ability of the grant to properly monitor and evaluate the performance of the program activities. Failure to file reports timely may result in jeopardizing future reimbursement of expended funds or award of future funding from the identified federal agencies. (Finding Code No. 2015-007, 2014-012, 2013-013, 12-16, 11-30)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure financial reports are reviewed and approved by someone other than the preparer, and the reports are filed in a timely manner.

University Response:

Not Accepted.

In three of the four reports listed under the first bullet, an Assistant Director (i.e., supervisor) prepared and submitted the reports. The University does not agree that an Assistant Director preparing a report requires an additional reviewer. No errors were noted on the reports.

Accepted.

UIC Response

One Federal Financial Report was submitted one day after the reporting deadline due to human error. One SF424 was submitted one day after the reporting deadline due to finalization of programmatic reporting components. One Federal Financial Report did not have documentation of a review due to human error and was delayed due to a need for confirmation of expenditures.

UIUC Response

UIUC agrees that one monthly financial status report was submitted late by the unit due to confusion on the due date. The PI was in communication with the Program Officer during the period of the late report. This was an isolated instance related to a report for Intelligence Advanced Research Projects Activity.

Auditors' Comment:

OMB Circular A-133 requires the auditor to identify and test controls to obtain a low level of control risk. We believe effective internal control should include a documented review and approval of required financial reports and we were unable to obtain evidence that the financial reports had been reviewed and approved by an individual other than the preparer. We also note there were several reporting errors identified in our testing as reported in finding 2015-009.

2015-008. Finding: Inadequate Support for Cash Requests

The University had inadequate accounting records to support reimbursement request for the Research and Development Cluster and the Head Start Cluster.

During our testing of 40 grants in the Research and Development Cluster and 2 grants for the Head Start Cluster for cash management procedures, we noted the following:

- For Research and Development grant award 2012-04164-00-00 at the Chicago campus, the grant agreement did not indicate that the reimbursement for expenditures would be on a fixed price. Total reimbursements for fiscal year 2015 were \$40,000 and expenditures totaled \$14,288 in the general ledger. Further discussion with the University indicated that a page of the grant agreement was missing and verbal understanding was reached for fixed price invoices; however, there was no formal documentation.
- For Research and Development grant award 2015-01238-00-00 at the Chicago campus, a payment in the amount of \$144,019 was applied twice via journal entry from a holding account to grant E2527 resulting in an overstatement of cash on the grant.

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- For Head Start grant award F9009 at the Chicago campus, it was noted the reimbursement request amounts did not reconcile by \$1,558.

OMB Circular A-110 Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals and Other Non-Profit Organizations (OMB Circular A-110), requires the University to minimize the time elapsing between the transfer of funds from the federal government and the payment of program expenditures. OMB Circular A-110 requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations and programs compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure reimbursement requests are properly supported by the University's accounting records.

In discussing this condition with University officials, they stated that the errors in the cash requests were due to human error.

Drawing federal funds based upon information other than the University's official accounting records may result in funds being drawn in advance of the University's immediate cash needs. (Finding Code No. 2015-008, 2014-010, 2013-010, 12-14, 11-28, 10-33)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure expenditures are recorded in the general ledger as they are incurred to ensure the reimbursement requests are adequately supported by the University's official accounting records.

University Response:

Accepted.

Research and Development

The invoices for 2012-04164-00-00 were clearly denoted as a scheduled billing, as instructed by internal and external award contacts. The invoices were accepted by the sponsor as evidenced by their continued payment of the invoices over a three year period.

Due to human error, the award E2527 had a duplicate payment applied to this award. The duplicate transfer did not result in an over billing to the sponsor and was corrected as a result of the holding account reconciliation.

Head Start

The unbilled amount, \$1,558, was a result of billing calculation errors caused by human error.

2015-009. Finding: Improper Reporting Amounts in Financial Status Reports

The University did not submit monthly invoices for the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) and Head Start in accordance to the grant reporting requirements.

During our testing of the TANF and Head Start monthly billing summary and performance measures we noted the reports did not reconcile to the general ledger for the following months selected for testing:

Additionally for Head Start, we noted 4 out of 4 monthly reports selected for testing were not filed on a timely basis. According to the Head Start grant award with the City of Chicago section 4.2 of the terms and conditions requires requisitions of reimbursement (vouchers) to be submitted at least monthly by the 15th of the following month of identifying payments due for services and/or costs incurred and paid directly by the grantee in such detail and supported by such documents as the City requires.

The Head Start monthly invoices/summary of expenditures were reviewed and submitted three to five months later than the required 15th of the month following the month that the expenditure was incurred.

Also, for TANF reporting, it was noted that the reason for the difference in the report versus general amount above was due to including the prior month's expenditures with the current month tested.

According to the TANF grant agreement number FCSTG03293 awarded from the Illinois Department of Human Services (DHS), services rendered are accounted for through the submittal of monthly reports and billings. The University is required to submit monthly reports and billings to DHS. Billings must be received from the University not later than the 10th of the month following the month of service.

OMB Circular A-110 requires nonfederal entities receiving Federal awards establish and maintain internal controls designed to reasonably ensure compliance with Federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure that monthly expenditure and performance reports are complete, accurate, and prepared in accordance to specific grant agreement policies.

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In discussing this condition with University officials, they stated there are various reasons for the reporting errors.

Failure to prepare monthly reports in accordance to grant requirements may result in reporting error to the funding agency. (Finding Code No. 2015-009, 2014-011, 2013-012, 12-07, 11-11, 10-15, 09-15)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure the information reported on the financial status reports are complete, accurate and filed on a timely basis.

University Response:

TANF

Accepted

While the University believes that it is correctly billing, we agree to modify the billing procedures.

The University of Illinois at Springfield submits the invoice to IDHS for the TANF grant once all payments are issued. In certain cases, payments for the student cross fiscal months over the program year. Per the Illinois Department of Human Services, as long as the student is eligible for the TANF scholarship funds, the University maintains documentation to verify all program requirements and the billing is submitted during the appropriate program year, the University is in compliance with billing requirements.

Head Start

Accepted.

The Head Start invoices go through a multi-step review within the administering department and then the Grants and Contracts Office in order to ensure accuracy and correctness prior to releasing to the sponsor. In addition, the award is often modified throughout the project term to add additional funding and/or revise the budget. Either of these modifications require a temporary hold on billing submissions, as the sponsor will not accept invoices while budget adjustments are in process. As a result, the invoices are commonly submitted in batches and beyond the 15th of the month.

The \$77 difference between the June 2015 invoice and the General Ledger is due to a miscoding error by an unaffiliated unit. The unaffiliated unit made a data entry error and has no relationship with the Head Start Program. Expenditures were monitored by the administering unit of the Head Start Program, and these miscodings were identified and correctly excluded from invoicing.

2015-010. Finding: Inadequate Procedures for Verifying Participant Eligibility

The University of Illinois did not have proper procedures in place to verify participant eligibility for the State's Child Care Assistance Program at the Illinois Child Care Resource Services (CCRS).

In relation to the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Grant, CCRS is the department for the University of Illinois designated to verify eligibility for participants receiving aid under the Child Care Resource Services program. The Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS) is responsible for setting the eligibility requirements, determines payment rates, and accredits providers. CCRS is responsible for the data entry process to the IDHS system, verifying eligibility per IDHS guidelines, calculating copay using IDHS spreadsheets, and retaining documentation and client files.

During our testing of 40 beneficiary files for the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Grant, we noted two beneficiary files where CCRS did not properly verify eligibility based on the information received from IDHS.

- In one case, we viewed the participant's grant history printout from IDHS's system, and noted that this participant's eligibility was not verified by a "Y" in the grant history column for the period of eligibility that is being tested. If there is not a "Y" in the grant history column, CCRS looks at the participant application to see if the individual indicated that they receive TANF assistance to confirm their eligibility. On the application the participant wrote "\$0" on the TANF Cash Assistance line. However, the IDHS screenshot with information that was entered by CCRS office shows TANF Cash Assistance of \$720. Upon further examination and inquiry of CCRS staff, the \$720 was entered on the application as Social Security Income, but CCRS mistakenly entered it in as TANF Cash Assistance. Therefore, CCRS incorrectly verified the eligibility and paid \$526 to the participant.
- In another case, we viewed the participant's grant history printout from IDHS' system, and noted that the participant's eligibility was not verified by a "Y" in the grant history column for the period of eligibility that is being tested. We then viewed the application and noted that the participant wrote "NA" on the TANF Cash Assistance line. However, the IDHS screenshot with information that was entered by the CCRS office shows TANF Cash Assistance of \$1,253. Upon further examination and inquiry of CCRS staff, the \$1,253 was entered on the application as Other Monthly Income, but CCRS mistakenly entered it in as TANF Cash Assistance. Therefore, CCRS incorrectly verified the eligibility and paid \$243 to the participant.

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In relation to the Child Care Development Funds Grant, CCRS is the department for the University of Illinois designated to receive and administer funds and aid under the Child Care Assistance Program to assist parents with child care needs. During our testing for 40 beneficiary payments disbursed totaling \$15,441 under the Child Care Assistance Program, we noted two beneficiary files with incorrect or incomplete financial eligibility determination information.

- In one case, the incorrect family size was used to determine the beneficiary's co-payment amount. Program regulations require beneficiary's co-payment amount to be determined by placing the family size and monthly income on the Illinois Department of Human Services Co-Payment Guidance Table. In this case, the beneficiary's application has a family size of four indicated. An incorrect family size of five was used on the Illinois Department of Human Services Co-Payment Guidance. The proper co-payment to be paid to the child care provider from the beneficiary was \$7 under what it should have been.
- In one case, the incorrect monthly income was used to determine financial eligibility. Monthly income is calculated based on support supplied by the beneficiary including wage statements, letters from employers, or based on the hours and wage rate the beneficiary claimed on the application (89 Ill. Admin. Code 50.110(d)). The use of the incorrect monthly income resulted in a financially ineligible beneficiary. A child care services voucher of \$164 was paid for the financially ineligible applicant.

The Illinois Department of Human Services Child Care Program Manual, Section 01, establishes guidelines for the eligibility criteria. Per this established eligibility criteria, an individual or family's eligibility for TANF grant money is ultimately determined by IDHS. When CCRS receives the beneficiary information for processing, they are responsible for verifying that eligibility has been determined by IDHS before information is processed for payment to the recipient. CCRS first checks the individual's grant history on the IDHS printout to see if a "Y" is listed under the months that the individual is determined to be eligible. If there is not a "Y" in the grant history for the months of eligibility, CCRS views the individual's application to see if they are receiving TANF Cash Assistance. If the individual indicates that they are not receiving TANF Cash Assistance, they need to verify their eligibility with IDHS and not process the information until the issue has been resolved.

Per Illinois Department of Human Services Child Care Program Manual Income Guidelines, Section 01.02.01, effective July 1, 2014, a family is considered income eligible when the combined gross monthly base income (earned and unearned) of all family members is at or below the amounts of income for the corresponding family size. In two-parent families, both incomes must be combined to determine eligibility. Two-parent families include those with 2 or more adults living in the home, such as the applicant and his or her spouse or parents of a common child in the home.

The Illinois Department of Human Services Monthly Income Guidelines has a 185% threshold of the Federal Poverty Guidelines published yearly by the U.S. Department of Health And Human Services (89 Ill. Admin. Code, 50.110(d); 50.230; 50.235).

OMB Circular A-110 requires nonfederal entities receiving Federal awards establish and maintain internal controls designed to reasonably ensure compliance with Federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure that the eligibility of beneficiaries is properly determined and documentation is maintained to support the determination review.

In discussing this condition with University officials, they stated these matters were the result of clerical errors.

Without effective internal controls over compliance, CCRS could allow an individual to receive financial support for applicants that are financially ineligible. Also, failure to perform verification of eligibility determinations in accordance with the program regulation may result in ineligible beneficiaries receiving services for which they are not eligible. (Finding Code No. 2015-010)

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Recommendation:

We recommend the University review its procedures for verifying participant eligibility and implement additional procedures to ensure the correct participant information is used to determine eligibility under the TANF and CCDF programs.

University Response:

Accepted.

The University agrees the income reported by the client was incorrectly entered into the TANF reporting field instead of the appropriate reporting field. The University does believe that the total income for the client was properly reported to IDHS, and benefits were properly determined.

However, the University believes that it correctly followed the guidance given directly from IDHS on working through issues with determinations of eligibility using its new system. The University entered a family size of four into the system, but issues within the Illinois Department of Human Services system converted and approved the individual for a family size of five. The information was correctly entered by the University. On July 1, 2014, the maximum allowed income increased to \$2,426. The income for this client was \$2,426 which was eligible. Due to a system issue, the University was only allowed to enter up to the prior year maximum of \$2,392. The University entered the maximum into the system and entered a work order into the IDHS system documenting the error and process used by the University. The benefits for the two amounts were the same so there was no financial impact. The use of the prior year amount did not result in an improper payment based on a financially ineligible beneficiary. The child care services voucher of \$164 was appropriately paid.

2015-011. Finding: Inadequate Off Campus Work Study Agreements

The University of Illinois Chicago campus was unable to provide off campus work study agreements.

During our testing of the federal work study program, we inquired if the University's three campuses utilize off campus employers for federal work study positions. The University's three campuses confirmed they do use off campus employers. However, the University's Chicago campus was not able to locate the written agreements with the employers; therefore, we were not able to test the agreements to ensure compliance with the federal regulations.

According to 34 CFR 675.20(b), if an institution wishes to have its students employed by a Federal, State or local public agency, or a private nonprofit or for-profit organization, it shall enter into a written agreement with that agency or organization.

OMB Circular A-110 requires nonfederal entities receiving Federal awards establish and maintain internal controls designed to reasonably ensure compliance with Federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure agreements exist with off campus employers utilized for work study.

In discussing this condition with University officials, due to staffing changes, the written agreements cannot be located.

The written agreement establishes the work conditions and indicates whether the institution or agency or organization shall pay the students employed. Without this agreement, the work conditions and payment could be in question. (Finding Code No. 2015-011)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University implement policies to ensure written work study agreements are maintained to properly support student off campus work agreements.

University Response:

Accepted.

The University of Illinois believes written agreements do exist. Due to staffing changes, the written agreements cannot be located. The replacement written agreements are currently being processed.

2015-012. Finding: Inaccurate Award Records

The University did not maintain accurate records related to award information.

The University utilizes an accounting system to track and maintain the official financial records of the University. As Federal awards are granted to the University, individuals from the University's post-award office enter the award details into the accounting system. During our review of 40 Research and Development Cluster grant awards, we noted the award information contained in the University's accounting system did not agree to the award documents for one award selected for testing. More specifically, we noted that within the award documents for award ILHH0203-10 all the proposal approval forms and subcontract 01-02 reported Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number as 14.902 and the accounting system identified the CFDA number as 14.906.

OMB circular A-110, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grant and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profits Organizations (OMB Circular A-110), requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include maintaining accurate financial records for grants received by the Federal government.

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In discussing this condition with University officials, they stated they agree that the CFDA number of the July 3, 2015 subaward modification was incorrectly reported on an award document due to an error.

Failure to adequately record grant awards may result in inaccurate subcontract agreements, inaccurate cash draw and reimbursement requests leading to noncompliance with cash management regulations and inaccurate reporting on the SEFA. (Finding Code No. 2015-012, 2014-018, 2013-014, 11-31)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure that the award information per the award documents received by the federal agency agrees to the award information entered into the University's accounting system and any updates from the federal agency are properly documented.

University Response:

Accepted.

The federal grant agreement was missing the CFDA information pertaining to this award. Upon further inquiry for the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards (SEFA) reconciliation, the University identified the discrepancy, and sponsor clarification was sought. An email from the sponsor was received during the 2015 fiscal year (FY) identifying all funding awarded under CFDA number 14.906. The University's accounting system was updated to reflect this change, and a subsequent subcontract amendment was issued in FY2015 notifying the subrecipient of the correct CFDA number and title.

2015-013. Finding: Failure to Communicate Required Information to Subrecipients

The University did not communicate required program information to subrecipients of the Research and Development Cluster program.

During our testwork of 40 subrecipient expenditures totaling \$49,430,167 for the Research and Development Cluster, we noted the following information was not communicated as follows:

- Two subrecipients (with expenditures totaling \$221,697) were not informed of the CFDA and title. The CFDA number was listed in the prime award, but was omitted for the sub agreement upon issuance of the sub award for award numbers 2013-04551-01 and 2013-04551-02.

According to OMB Circular A-133 .400(d), a pass-through entity is required to identify Federal awards made by informing each subrecipient of CFDA title and number, award name and number, award year, if the award is research and development, and name of the Federal agency. When some of this information is not available, the pass-through entity shall provide the best information available to describe the Federal award.

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Additionally, OMB Circular A-110 requires nonfederal entities receiving awards to establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal control should include procedures to ensure required information is communicated prior to the issuance of the subaward.

In discussing this condition with University officials, they stated the subrecipients were not notified of the CFDA number due to human error.

Failure to communicate required information could result in subrecipients not properly administering the federal programs in accordance with federal regulations. (Finding Code No. 2015-013, 2014-020)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University review its procedures for communicating information to subrecipients and implement the procedures necessary to ensure information is included in the subrecipient award documents at the time of funding.

University Response:

Accepted.

The University agrees that the two subrecipients on award 2013-04551 were not notified of the CFDA number and title upon issuance of the award as a result of human error. The two subrecipients were subsequently notified and correctly reported the CFDA number and title on their respective SEFA's.

The University will review its procedures for communicating information to subrecipients and revise if necessary to ensure information is included in the award documents at the time of the issuance of the award.

The two subrecipient awards were pass-through funding on one award from United States Agency for International Development.

2015–014. Finding: Failure to Obtain Suspension and Debarment Information from a Vendor

The University did not obtain required information for a procurement vendor to verify the vendor was not suspended or debarred from participation in federal assistance programs for the Research and Development cluster.

During our testing of nine procurement expenditures totaling \$1,708,187, we noted one expenditure of \$28,200 from a vendor file that did not contain proper documentation for suspension and debarment verification in the System for Award Management (SAM).

According to OMB Circular A-110, nonfederal entities are prohibited from contracting with or making subawards under covered transactions to parties that are suspended or debarred or whose principals are suspended or debarred. “Covered transactions” include those procurement contracts for goods and services awarded under nonprocurement transaction (e.g., grant or cooperative agreement) that are expected to equal or exceed \$25,000 or meet certain other specified criteria. All nonprocurement transactions (i.e., subawards to subrecipients), irrespective of award amount, are considered covered transactions. When a non-federal entity enters into a covered transaction with an entity at a lower tier, the non-federal entity must verify that the entity is not suspended or debarred or otherwise excluded. This verification may be accomplished by checking SAM, collecting a certification from the entity, or adding a clause or condition to the covered transaction with that entity.

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OMB Circular A-110 also requires nonfederal entities receiving federal awards establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures in place to ensure the required certifications for covered contracts and subawards are received, documented, and contracts not made with a debarred or suspended party.

In discussing this condition with University officials, they stated that this was an isolated instance and was a result of human error.

Failure to obtain the required certifications or perform verification procedures with the SAM could result in the payment of federal funds to vendors that are suspended or debarred from participation in federal assistance programs. (Finding Code No. 2015-014, 2014-021)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University obtain certifications from vendor stating that their organization is not suspended, debarred, or otherwise excluded from participation in federal assistance programs or document the procedures performed to verify the vendor is not identified as suspended or debarred on SAM.

University Response:

Accepted.

The University agrees that due to human error this procurement did not follow the standard procurement practice used by the University to ensure that vendors are not suspended and debarred. We believe this is an isolated instance. The University will review and update procedures to ensure the verification of vendors is performed. The expenditure was on a U.S. Department of Agriculture National Institute of Food and Agriculture award.

2015-015. Finding: Inadequate Review of Direct Loan Reconciliations

The University's campuses financial aid departments are not performing a documented independent review of Direct Loan Reconciliations that are being performed monthly at each campus by financial aid staff.

The Springfield campus indicated that an independent review is being performed; however there is no documentation supporting that a review was being performed, such as a signature or email from the independent reviewer. The Chicago and Urbana campuses acknowledged that no independent review is being performed.

According to 34 CFR section 685.102 and the Federal Student Aid Handbook, Volume 4, Chapter 6, reconciliation is a mandatory monthly process requiring the comparison of both internal and external records to be completed by a University participating in the Direct Loan Program. Reconciliation is conducted to identify and resolve differences between net draws and disbursements reported to the Common Origination and Disbursement for a specific award year. A University must document the reasons and resolve the discrepancies identified during the reconciliation process and that a review had been performed.

OMB Circular A-110 requires nonfederal entities receiving Federal awards establish and maintain internal controls designed to reasonably ensure compliance with Federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure the Direct Loan Reconciliation is being performed and reviewed timely.

In discussing this condition with University officials, the review of the Direct Loan Reconciliation is being performed; however, there is no formal documented review.

The lack of independent documented review of the direct loan reconciliations being performed by student financial aid staff could result in errors in the reconciliation going undetected by student financial aid management. Implementation of documented independent review controls at each campus will assist in establishing effective internal controls surrounding the direct loan reconciliations and minimize the likelihood that errors may go undetected and not be corrected in a timely manner. (Finding Code No. 2015-015)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University implement a formal review procedure to document the direct loan reconciliations are performed on a timely basis each month.

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University Response:

UIS Response:

Accepted.

UIS is currently in compliance with all US Department of Education guidelines for Direct Loan Reconciliation. We acknowledge that evidence of the University's secondary review was not formally documented.

UIUC Response:

Accepted.

UIUC believes the Direct Loan reconciliation was completed as required by 34 CFR section 685.102 and the Federal Student Aid Handbook, Volume 4, Chapter 6. There were no cited errors on the reconciliation during the audit. UIUC acknowledges that no secondary review by another individual was being done.

UIC Response:

Accepted.

UIC is currently in compliance with all US Department of Education guidelines for Direct Loan Reconciliation. UIC acknowledges that no secondary review by another individual was being done. The reconciler was reviewing the reconciliation a second time. There were no cited errors on the reconciliation.

2015-016. Finding: Errors in Reporting for National Student Loan Data Systems (NSLDS)

Throughout the 2014-15 award year, we noted that error records were being returned on the enrollment reporting rosters that were sent to National Student Loan Data System (NSLDS) and those error records were not being corrected and resubmitted within the required 10 days.

The University uses a third-party vendor to process their enrollment reporting. During the year, the vendor had internal issues that prevented them from correcting error records and returning them within the required 10 days. The University did not have a process in place to oversee the work provided by the vendor to timely determine that the error records were not corrected and returned within 10 days.

According to 34 CFR 685.309, institutions are required to update all information in the enrollment reports received from NSLDS and return the report to the Secretary within 30 days. In addition, page 2-48 of the Federal Student Aid Handbook requires institutions to correct and resubmit error records within 10 days.

OMB Circular A-110 requires nonfederal entities receiving Federal awards establish and maintain internal controls designed to reasonably ensure compliance with Federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure enrollment reporting is timely completed.

In discussing this condition with University officials, they stated current internal controls did not verify that no error files were related to the University of Illinois.

Reporting accurate and timely enrollment data is important as the enrollment data is used to determine if a student's loan should enter the grace period and eventually repayment. By not reporting accurate data in a timely manner in accordance with federal regulations, it is possible that a student may not enter repayment timely. (Finding Code No. 2015-016)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University review current processes for reporting to NSLDS and implement procedures to ensure submissions are reported timely for enrollment status.

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University Response:

Accepted.

The University has evaluated the third party vendor 2015 compliance attestation report, and the University does not believe there is sufficient information provided by the third party vendor to support that no errors were related to the University. While the third party vendor has communicated that they have notified the affected Universities of the untimely error processing cited in the third party vendor's own compliance attestation report (did not include the University of Illinois), the University of Illinois acknowledges the possibility of exceptions not discovered during the audit process.

The third party vendor's Report on Managements' Assertions on Compliance with Specified Requirements Applicable to the Federal Student Financial Assistance Programs indicates that the vendor has identified and promptly remediated noncompliance. The third party vendor concurs with the Auditor's recommendation to implement additional internal controls to ensure the timely receipt, processing and tracking of SSCR error files, error file responses and file receipt acknowledgements for data submitted to the NSLDS by the vendor.

2015-017. Finding: Over-Award of Title IV Funds

The University's Springfield Campus over-awarded one student Title IV Funds.

During our student file testing we noted one student out of 60 (2%) was awarded more Title IV funds than they qualified for. The Springfield campus Student Financial Aid (SFA) department awarded a student more need based aid than their calculated need defined by federal guidelines. The University's Springfield campus SFA department should have awarded a Federal Work Study amount of \$3,305 instead of \$4,500, resulting in an over-award of \$1,195. However, because the student had only earned \$3,644 of the Federal Work Study awarded, the student's actual over-award was only \$339. But because there is a \$300 over-award tolerance for Federal Work Study dollars, the amount that needs to be returned to the Department of Education is \$39.

According to Title IV, Part F of the Higher Education Act, a student is considered to have an over-award if the student's award exceeds his or her cost of attendance. A student must have financial need to receive aid and total awards may not exceed need.

OMB Circular A-110 requires nonfederal entities receiving Federal awards establish and maintain internal controls designed to reasonably ensure compliance with Federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure students are awarded within the prescribed limits.

In discussing this condition with University officials, the overaward occurred due to a late Pell disbursement.

Failure to properly award student financial aid could jeopardize future Federal funding. (Finding Code No. 2015-017)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University review current procedures for awarding Title IV Funds and implement procedures to ensure students are not over-awarded federal funds.

University Response:

Accepted.

The University acknowledges that the over-award occurred due to a late Pell disbursement. The University will review its procedures to ensure students are not over-awarded federal funds.

2015-018. Finding: Inadequate Return of Title IV Fund Calculation

The University did not accurately complete Return of Title IV calculations for students.

The University used the incorrect number of days in the term for the Return of Title IV (R2T4). Out of the 34 students tested at University of Illinois at Urbana/Champaign, we noted 4 (12%) students in which the University did not accurately complete the Return of Title IV calculation. The University used the last day classes were held for the end of the term rather than the last day of exams which are a requirement of the courses.

The University of Illinois at Chicago failed to perform Return to Title IV calculations for students who withdrew during the University's ten day add/drop period.

Out of the 22 students tested at University of Illinois at Chicago, we noted 2 (9%) students in which the University did not accurately complete the Return of Title IV calculation. For one student the form was signed on 11/3/14 but the University used 11/1/14 as the withdrawal date for the R2T4 calculation. For the second student, the withdrawal form indicated the last date of attendance was 11/7/14 but 11/11/14 was used in the R2T4 calculation. However, both of these students completed greater than 60% of term and as such had earned all their aid and no funds were required to be returned to the Department of Education.

Out of the 22 students tested at University of Illinois at Chicago, we noted the form a student completes for an official withdrawal does not have a field to record the date when the form was completed by the student. For the purposes of the calculation of the Return of Title IV funds (R2T4), the date the student began the institution's withdrawal process is the withdrawal date for Title IV purposes.

According to 34 CFR 668.22, institutions are required to complete accurate Return of Title IV calculations as defined in the regulations. The number of days to include in the denominator should include the number of calendar days within the period the student is required to be in class, including final exams.

According to 34 CFR 668.22, institutions are required to complete accurate Return of Title IV calculations as defined in the regulations. A student that provides official notification of his or her intent to withdrawal, for the purposes of calculation of the Return of Title IV funds, the date the student began the institution's withdrawal process is the withdrawal date for Title IV purposes. A student begins earning Title IV funds on his or her first day of attendance. Therefore, even if a student withdraws before a school's census date, the school must perform a Return calculation using the number of days the student attended class as the numerator in the calculation of the percentage of aid earned.

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OMB Circular A-110 requires nonfederal entities receiving Federal awards establish and maintain internal controls designed to reasonably ensure compliance with Federal laws, regulations, and program compliance requirements. Effective internal controls should include procedures to ensure the Return of Title IV calculations are accurate.

In discussing this condition with University officials, the inadequate Return of Title IV calculations were a result of human errors and a change in how withdrawals are processed.

The Return of Title IV calculation determines the amount of federal financial assistance that the student is entitled to and is based on the number of days they completed in the period. Using the incorrect number of days in the term in the Return of Title IV calculations results in incorrect return calculations and additional funds that should be returned to the Department of Education.

Further, for students who withdrew before the 10 day census date, the student earned aid for which they were not disbursed. Additionally, adding the date the form was completed by the student would better document the withdrawal date to use in the R2T4 calculation. (Finding Code No. 2015-018)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University review its current procedures for Title IV funds and implement additional procedures to ensure funds are properly and timely returned.

University Response:

UIUC Response:

Accepted.

The University agrees that an incorrect date of attendance was used to complete the Title IV calculations. This was the result of a manual error in the setup of the calendar in the Department of Education R2T4 tool.

UIC Response:

Accepted.

The University agrees with the finding that a R2T4 calculation was not completed for the students that withdrew during the 10 day add/drop period and that the school must perform a Return calculation using the number of days the student attended. Due to a change in how withdrawals are processed within the Registrar's office, the Office of Student Financial Aid had not updated their processes but has subsequently done so.

The University agrees that the incorrect withdrawal date was used for the Return of Title IV Funds. The student's college provided the incorrect withdrawal date for one of the students listed in the finding. Withdrawal dates are reported by the student's college and then subsequently reported to the University Registrar who then reports the date to the Office of Student Financial Aid. In the case of both students, the withdrawal date occurred after the students completed 60% of the term; therefore, no additional funds needed to be returned back to the Department of Education.

2015-019. Finding: Failure to Obtain Required Information from Subrecipient

The University did not maintain adequate support that they obtained the subrecipient's nine-digit Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number.

During our review of 40 subrecipients in the Research and Development cluster, we noted the University did not provide support that they obtained the DUNS number from one subrecipient for award number 2013-04026-10 in the amount of \$46,157. The University subaward review and approval documents for first-tier subawards should document whether they obtained the DUNS number from non-ARRA subrecipients prior to the issuance of the subaward.

According to 2 CFR Part 25, grant and cooperative agreement award recipients must have a valid DUNS number prior to issuance of a subaward.

Additionally, OMB Circular A-110 requires nonfederal entities receiving awards to establish and maintain internal control designed to reasonably ensure compliance with federal laws, regulations, and programs compliance requirements. Effective internal control should include procedures to ensure required information is obtained prior to the issuance of the subaward.

In discussing this condition with University officials, they stated that due to human error the DUNS number was not obtained prior to issuance of the award.

The federal government uses this number to track how federal money is allocated and the DUNS number verifies creditworthiness of the entity. (Finding Code No. 2015-019)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University review its procedures for obtaining required subrecipient information and implement procedures necessary to ensure the subrecipient information is received and maintained prior to the issuance of the sub award.

University Response:

Accepted.

The University agrees that due to human error the DUNS number for this subrecipient was not obtained prior to issuance of the award. The DUNS number was subsequently obtained by the University. While the University believes this was an isolated instance, it will review its procedures to ensure the information is obtained in a timely manner. The Sponsor is United States Agency for International Development.

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2015-020. Finding: Contracts and Real Property Leases Not Properly Executed

The University has not established adequate internal controls over contracts and leases to ensure all necessary approvals are received and the agreements are executed prior to the performance and filed with the State of Illinois Office of the Comptroller on a timely basis.

During our review of 70 contracts, including purchase orders, executed during the fiscal year ended June 30, 2015, we noted the following:

- Ten contracts did not contain the signature of the employee signing on behalf of the University Comptroller.
- Four contracts were not signed by the University's Chief Executive Officer or Chief Legal Counsel out of 60 contracts sampled requiring this level of approval.
- Two contracts were executed subsequent to the start date of the contracts. The contract execution dates were 28 and 100 days from the commencement of service.
- Three contracts were not approved by the University's Board of Trustees, as required. Two of three contracts were approved 35 and 72 days after the contract execution date and one contract was not approved at all.
- Five contracts did not contain disclosure of financial interest statements as required. One of the five was submitted 394 days late and the remaining four contracts did not have the disclosure of financial interest statements.
- One procurement (amounting to \$68,175) was not procured through a competitive sealed bid process as required by the Illinois Procurement Code. In addition, other Illinois Procurement Code requirements such as posting to the Illinois Public Higher Education Procurement Bulletin, filing of contracts with the Comptroller's Office, and submission of standard vendor certifications were also not complied with.
- Two procurements reviewed had errors on evaluation scores. The errors noted did not affect results of the procurement process.
- One procurement did not have all completed score sheets for each individual evaluator in the procurement file. The score sheets of two of three evaluators were missing.
- Four contracts did not have standard vendor certifications, as required. Two of the four contracts did not contain the certification by the vendor to maintain and make available records to the State for audit purposes and two contracts did not have standard vendor certifications.
- Two contracts were awarded to vendors not registered with the State Board of Elections.
- Sixteen contracts were not submitted to the State Comptroller's Office, as required. Five of the 16 contracts were filed four to 204 days late and 11 contracts were not submitted at all.

During our review of 25 real property leases executed during the year ended June 30, 2015, we noted the following:

- Five lease agreements did not contain the signature of the employee signing on behalf of the University Comptroller.
- Five leases were executed after the lease term began. The lease execution dates ranged from 16 to 66 days after the beginning of the lease.
- Three leases were not paid in accordance with lease terms resulting in underpayment of \$6,043.
- One lease agreement was not signed by the University's Chief Executive Officer and Chief Legal Counsel out of two lease agreements sampled requiring this level of approval.
- Seven lease agreements did not have disclosure of financial interest statements.
- Ten lease agreements did not contain the certification by the vendor to maintain and make available records to the State for audit purposes.

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- Five Real Estate Disclosure forms were not properly and timely completed, as required. Of the five Real Estate Disclosure forms, one was not notarized, two were signed 14 and 105 days after the beginning of the lease term, and two were not completed at all.
- Four lease agreements were not timely submitted to the State Comptroller's Office. The lease agreements were filed 18 to 327 days late.

During our review of 21 emergency purchases occurred during the year ended June 30, 2015, we noted the following:

- One contract was procured as an emergency when none of the emergency purchase conditions were met.
- Two emergency purchases conditions were not accurately posted in the Illinois Procurement Bulletin.
- Ten emergency purchases were not filed with the Office of the Auditor General, as required. Six out of the 10 emergency purchases were filed one to 106 days late and four emergency purchases were not filed at all.

The Illinois Procurement Code (Code) (30 ILCS 500 et seq) and Statewide Accounting Management System (Procedure 15.20 et. seq. and 15.10.40) require contracts and real property leases to contain certain signatures, clauses, and certifications, and also require State agencies to file contracts, purchase orders and leases exceeding \$20,000 with the Office of the State Comptroller within 30 calendar days after execution. Moreover, except as otherwise provided by the Illinois Procurement Code, all State contracts shall be awarded by competitive sealed bids. 30 ILCS 500/20-30 (a) states that in accordance with standards set by rule, a purchasing agency may make emergency procurements without competitive sealed bidding or prior notice when there exists a threat to public health or public safety, or when immediate expenditure is necessary for repairs to State property in order to protect against further loss of or damage to State property, to prevent or minimize serious disruption in critical State services that affect health, safety, or collection of substantial State revenues, or to ensure the integrity of State records; provided, however, that the term of the emergency purchase shall be limited to the time reasonably needed for a competitive procurement, not to exceed 90 days. Notice of all emergency procurements shall be provided to the Procurement Policy Board and published in the online electronic Bulletin. The section also states that a chief procurement officer shall file affidavits with the Procurement Policy Board and the Auditor General of the State of Illinois within 10 days after the procurement setting forth the amount expended.

Further, the State Finance Act (30 ILCS 105/9.02) states that new contract, contract renewal, order against a master contract, or any contract amendment of \$250,000 or more in a fiscal year, shall be signed or approved in writing by the agency's chief executive officer, chief legal counsel and chief fiscal officer.

In addition, the University of Illinois Business and Financial Policies and Procedures (Section 1) and good business practices require all contracts and leases to be properly approved and fully executed prior to the beginning of the lease term or the commencement of services. Additionally, the Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (30 ILCS 10/3001), requires the University to establish and maintain a system or systems of internal controls, which shall provide assurance that: (1) resources are utilized effectively, and in compliance with applicable law; (2) obligations and cost are in compliance with applicable law; (3) funds, property, and other assets and resources are safeguarded against waste, loss, unauthorized use, and misappropriation; (4) revenues, expenditures, and transfers of assets, resources, or funds applicable to operations are properly recorded and accounted for to permit the preparation of accounts and reliable financial and statistical reports and to maintain accountability over the State's resources; and (5) funds held outside the State Treasury are managed, used, and obtained in strict accordance with the terms of their enabling authorities and that no unauthorized funds exists. The University's system of internal controls should include procedures to ensure that evaluation materials are complete and accurate, and contracts and leases contain all necessary provisions, properly approved, and fully executed prior to performance.

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In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated that given the large number of contracts processed by the University there are occasions when certain State and University requirements and University best business practices are not met. University management indicated the bulleted exceptions largely resulted from human error, technical deficiencies or process interpretation and oversight.

Failure to fully execute a contract or real property lease prior to the commencement of services or lease term leaves the University vulnerable to unnecessary liabilities and potential legal issues, and failure to ensure that evaluation scores are accurate may affect the University's ability to award a contract to the most qualified vendor. In addition, failure to include all appropriate signatures, clauses, and certifications in contracts and leases, failure to file contracts and real property leases with the Office of the Comptroller on a timely basis, failure to maintain evaluation documents in the procurement files, and failure to follow emergency purchase requirements result in noncompliance with State statutes and regulations. (Finding Code No. 2015-020, 2014-022, 2013-018, 12-18, 11-32, 10-35, 09-35, 08-09, 07-10, 06-07, 05-05, 04-05, 03-06)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University establish appropriate procedures to ensure that all contracts and leases are completed, approved, and properly executed prior to the start of the services and lease term, and to ensure that evaluation scores are accurate. Further, the University should review procedures to ensure all appropriate signatures, clauses and certifications are obtained prior to execution for all contracts and lease agreements and that all applicable contracts, real estate leases, and emergency purchases are filed with the Office of the Comptroller and the Auditor General of the State of Illinois in accordance with the State statutes and related guidelines.

University Response:

Accepted. The University recognizes the importance of process controls, training, and transaction monitoring in these areas and has already taken corrective action to address some of the recommendations in this finding. Enhancements to the enterprise-wide Illinois Contract System (ICS) were made that included the addition of names and titles of all Comptroller delegates and the implementation of automatic notifications to staff responsible for timely filing of contracts to the State. In addition, Purchasing staff received refresher training in December 2014 and January 2015 that included the requirements for procurement contracts exceeding \$249,999. Additional corrective actions will be taken to address the remaining recommendations in this finding.

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2015-021. Finding: Failure to Follow Time Reporting Requirements

The University does not require all employees to submit time sheets as required by the State Officials and Employees Ethics Act.

During our testing of payroll, we selected 25 employees across all three campuses and noted the following:

- Nine employees (three from the Champaign-Urbana campus, five from the Chicago campus, and one from the Springfield campus) did not file time sheets as required by the State Officials and Employees Ethics Act. Based upon inquiry of the University management, faculty, postdoctoral employees, and instructors continue to track their time using a “negative” timekeeping system whereby the employee is assumed to be working unless noted otherwise.
- One employee from the Chicago campus under the academic professional employee class did not submit time sheets starting January 2015, as required by the University policy.

The State Officials and Employees Ethics Act (the Act) (5 ILCS 430/1-5) defines “State agency” to include “public institutions of higher learning...” and defines “State employee” to be “any employee of a State agency.” The Act required the Illinois Board of Higher Education (IBHE), with respect to State employees of public universities, to adopt and implement personnel policies. The Act (5 ILCS 430/5-5(c)) also states, “The policies shall require State employees to periodically submit time sheets documenting the time spent each day on official State business to the nearest quarter hour; contractual State employees may satisfy the time sheets requirement by complying with the terms of their contract, which shall provide for a means of compliance with this requirement.” The IBHE adopted personnel policies for public universities on February 3, 2004 in accordance with the Act. The University has not incorporated these policies into the University’s policies.

The University Reporting Policy for the State Officials and Employees Ethics Act (SOEEA) requires all Academic Professional and Civil Service employees to document all hours worked, using the University’s Online Reporting tool, while conducting official University business.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated that due to the unique nature of faculty, graduate assistants, and medical resident’s work, the creative process for the development and discovery of new knowledge does not fit in with traditional Monday through Friday forty-hour work week. Tracking time that is put into the preparation of instructional materials, research, public service and economic development takes place anytime and anywhere on a continuing basis and is very difficult to quantify. Faculty productivity is evaluated through the tenure process and annually for tenured faculty. Each campus continues to track faculty, graduate assistants and medical residents through a timekeeping system whereby the employee reports their leave.

Failure to follow and ensure that all employees comply with the time reporting requirements of the Act results in noncompliance with State statute. (Finding Code No. 2015-021, 2014-023, 2013-016, 12-19, 11-33, 10-37, 09-40, 08-11, 07-11, 06-06, 05-06)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure all employees submit time sheets as required by the Act.

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University Response:

Accepted. There is ongoing dialogue with the academic leadership at each University campus regarding further implementation of this requirement.

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CURRENT FINDINGS – STATE COMPLIANCE
Year Ended June 30, 2015**

2015-022. Finding: Statutory Mandates - Noncompliance with the School Code

The University did not include courses required by the Illinois School Code in its curriculum.

During our review of the University's compliance with the Illinois School Code, we noted that the University's curriculum at the Chicago and Springfield campuses did not require courses in methods and materials of physical education for teachers.

The School Code (105 ILCS 5/27-9) requires that curriculum in all State universities contain courses in methods and materials of physical education and training for teachers. No student or elementary school teacher shall be graduated from such a university who has not had a minimum of one course in methods and materials in the teaching of physical education and training.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated that the University was in compliance with the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) standards. However, the ISBE standards were not in compliance with the School Code. Having this discrepancy brought to their attention, ISBE adjusted their standards to require curriculum modules on physical education to meet school code. The new program was approved by ISBE on 1/9/15 and Illinois Board of Higher Education (IBHE) on 8/11/15.

Failure to include required courses in the University's curriculum instruction results in noncompliance with the School Code. (Finding Code No. 2015-022, 2014-028)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University review its process and consider changes necessary to ensure required courses are included in the University's curriculum.

University Response:

Accepted. At UIC, updates were made that incorporated physical education curriculum into course ED 450. The changes were effective Fall 2015. At UIS, updates were made that incorporated physical education curriculum into course UNI 210. The changes will be effective Summer 2016.

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CURRENT FINDINGS – STATE COMPLIANCE
Year Ended June 30, 2015**

2015-023. Finding: Sabbatical Reports Not Submitted in Accordance with University Policies and Procedures

The University does not have adequate procedures to monitor submission of sabbatical reports from employees returning from sabbatical leaves.

During our review of 25 employees who both returned from sabbatical leave and were required to submit a sabbatical report during fiscal year ended June 30, 2015, we noted the following:

- Three employees from the Chicago campus did not submit their required written sabbatical reports on their activities, study, and travel during the leave, within the required time frames. Additionally, the sabbatical reports were not transmitted from the college offices to the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and Provost within the required time frames. Delays in submitting these reports ranged from 10 to 24 days after the required time frames.
- The sabbatical report for one employee from the Springfield campus was not transmitted from the college office to the Office of the Provost within the required time frame. The report was submitted five days later than the required time frame.

The University's formal policy on Sabbatical Leaves requires faculty members to submit, in duplicate, a written report on his or her activities, study, and travel during the leave upon returning from a sabbatical leave. The submission of sabbatical reports should be made through the normal channel, through executive officer, dean/director, or Chancellor. In addition, the Springfield campus' Faculty Personnel Policies require faculty to submit the report early in the Fall semester of the year following the sabbatical in accordance with the Campus Academic Personnel Calendar. Chicago campus' Faculty Policies, Procedures and Guidelines require faculty to submit the report within 60 calendar days from January 1st of the same academic year for sabbatical taken during the Fall semester, and within 60 calendar days from August 16th of the next academic year for sabbatical taken during the Spring semester.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated that: (a) for the Chicago campus, the academic year 2014-2015 sabbatical application cycle was the first year that the new reporting guidelines for sabbatical leaves were implemented. The exceptions were due to human error and staff turnover; and (b) for the Springfield campus, the faculty member initially turned the sabbatical report into the Provost Office in a timely manner, but required follow-up due to missing signature.

Failure to submit written sabbatical reports summarizing employee activities, study, and travel during the leave, within the required time frame, inhibits the University's ability to monitor employee sabbatical leaves and results in noncompliance with the University's policies and procedures. (Finding Code No. 2015-023, 2014-029, 2013-025, 12-28)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University review its process for monitoring employee sabbatical leaves and consider any changes necessary to ensure all written sabbatical leave reports are properly completed and submitted within the required timeframes.

University Response:

Accepted. The vacancy at UIC has been filled and notifications of sabbatical leave report due dates are being consistently provided. At UIS, the Provost Office has implemented a more complete tracking system to monitor the receipt of Sabbatical reports.

**STATE OF ILLINOIS
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CURRENT FINDINGS – STATE COMPLIANCE
Year Ended June 30, 2015**

2015-024. Finding: Noncompliance with State Vehicle Use Act

The University failed to comply with the provisions of the State Vehicle Use Act (Act) and did not properly calculate and report fringe benefits related to personal use of State vehicles.

To monitor the use of State vehicles, the University requires employees with assigned State vehicles to submit and certify, on annual basis, the total mileage used and the total commuting mileage associated with the State vehicle on an Employee Statement of Employer Provided Vehicles form. This form is used by Payroll to calculate the amount of fringe benefits to report as gross income for each employee.

During our review of the fringe benefit expenses for nine employees assigned a State vehicle, we noted that fringe benefits for two employees were not properly calculated, resulting in understatement of the employees' gross income by \$855 in total. Based on our review of related Employee Statement of Employer Provided Vehicles form for these two employees, we noted that total annual mileage used on assigned vehicle was not properly reported.

Additionally, we noted that the University's vehicle use policy submitted to the Illinois Department of Central Management Services' (Department) Division of Vehicles did not contain procedures regarding daily vehicle use logs and mileage recording as required by the Act.

The State Vehicle Use Act (30 ILCS 617/10) requires that each State agency shall designate a vehicle use officer to monitor the use of State-owned vehicles by that State agency, and with the assistance of the vehicle use officer, shall draft a vehicle use policy. The vehicle use policy shall be submitted to the Division of Vehicles within the Department and shall be made publicly available on the Department's official internet website. The Act further requires the vehicle use policy include the following: (1) a policy concerning take-home vehicles, including requirements for emergency use of take-home vehicles and restrictions on the use of take-home vehicles solely for commuting; and (2) procedures regarding daily vehicle use logs and mileage recording.

The Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (30 ILCS 10/3001), requires the University to establish and maintain a system or systems of internal fiscal and administrative controls, which shall provide assurance that: (1) resources are utilized efficiently, effectively, and in compliance with applicable law; (2) obligations and costs are in compliance with applicable law; (3) funds, property, and other assets and resources are safeguarded against waste, loss, unauthorized use, and misappropriation; (4) revenues, expenditures, and transfers of assets, resources, or funds applicable to operations are properly recorded and accounted for to permit the preparation of accounts and reliable financial and statistical reports and to maintain accountability over the State's resources; and (5) funds held outside the State Treasury are managed, used, and obtained in strict accordance with the terms of their enabling authorities and that no unauthorized funds exist. The University's system of internal controls should include procedures to ensure accurate reporting of fringe benefits related to the personal use of State vehicles.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated that employee misunderstanding in the completion of the Employee Statement of Employer Provided Vehicles form led to the two exceptions noted. In both instances, staff reported the odometer reading from the vehicle rather than the total miles driven during the reporting period. The University has not yet updated existing vehicle policy to include procedures regarding daily vehicle use logs and mileage recording.

Failure to include procedures regarding daily vehicle use logs and mileage recording in vehicle use policy results in noncompliance with the Act. Failure to properly calculate and report fringe benefits related to personal use of State vehicles results in inaccurate reporting of gross income for employees. (Finding Code No. 2015-024, 2014-031)

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Year Ended June 30, 2015**

Recommendation:

We recommend the University implement procedures to ensure all necessary provisions are included in the vehicle use policy as required by the Act, and review its current procedures for monitoring the personal use of State vehicles and calculating the related fringe benefits and consider any changes necessary to ensure the related fringe benefits are properly calculated and reported.

University Response:

Accepted. The University will take the necessary corrective action to implement the recommendation in this finding.

Year Ended June 30, 2015**

2015-025. Finding: Statutory Mandates – Pension Code

The University did not comply with the requirements of the Pension Code (Code) on the employment and re-employment of State University Retirement System (SURS) annuitants.

During our testwork over 25 employees receiving retirement annuity from SURS, we noted the University did not timely notify SURS of its employment or re-employment of four SURS annuitants (one from the Urbana-Champaign campus and three from the Chicago campus). Delays in notification ranged from 34 to 332 days late.

The Illinois Pension Code (40 ILCS 5/15-139.5(a)) states that “An employer who employs or re-employs a person receiving a retirement annuity from the System in an academic year beginning on or after August 1, 2013 must notify the System of that employment within 60 days after employing the annuitant. The notice must include a summary of the contract of employment or specify the rate of compensation and the anticipated length of employment of that annuitant. The notice must specify whether the annuitant will be compensated from federal, corporate, foundation, or trust funds or grants of State funds that identify the principal investigator by name. The notice must include the employer’s determination of whether or not the annuitant is an “affected annuitant”.”

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated that they attribute the audit findings to growing pains of implementing a new requirement. While they strive for 100% compliance, with the decentralized nature of Human Resources, the rollout of a new process can take some time to fully implement.

Failure to timely notify SURS of the employment or re-employment of a person receiving a retirement annuity results in noncompliance with the Pension Code and may inhibit the ability of SURS to properly monitor and evaluate retirement payments of its annuitants. (Finding Code No. 2015-025, 2014-033)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University ensure notification of employment or re-employment of a person receiving a retirement annuity from SURS is in compliance with the Code.

University Response:

Accepted. The University has developed processes and procedures regarding Retiree Rehires. We also developed a system to collect and process the appropriate information so that, given our size and decentralized nature of our HR processes, we have more accurate data and compliance. We have educated our Human Resources areas at all campuses, and increased communication with our hiring units regarding this requirement. We are identifying units or areas where additional training may be needed to ensure the new processes are followed for timely reporting.

**STATE OF ILLINOIS
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CURRENT FINDINGS – STATE COMPLIANCE
Year Ended June 30, 2015**

2015-026. Finding: Noncompliance with the University of Illinois Act Regarding Proficiency in the English Language

The University did not follow its established procedures for documenting that certain individuals (tenure-system faculty and “other academic” staff members) providing instructions are orally proficient in the English language in accordance with the University of Illinois Act (the Act).

The University established policies and procedures at each campus to assess the oral English language proficiency of classroom instructors. Each campus requires documentation to assess or certify the instructor’s proficiency with English; however, during our review of 15 tenure-system and “other academic” classroom instructors, we noted the following:

- The required assessments of oral English proficiency were not completed in a timely manner for six instructors sampled from the Springfield campus. The assessments were completed nine to 39 days after the employees’ appointment dates.
- The completion of required assessment of oral English proficiency cannot be determined for one instructor sampled from the Springfield campus.
- The Certification of Oral English Proficiency forms were not completed for six instructors sampled from the Urbana-Champaign campus.

The University of Illinois Act (110 ILCS 305/7c) states that “The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois shall establish a program to assess the oral English language proficiency of all persons providing classroom instruction to students at each campus under the jurisdiction, governance or supervision of the Board, and shall ensure that each person who is not orally proficient in the English language attain such proficiency prior to providing any classroom instruction to students. The program required by this Section shall be fully implemented to ensure the oral English language proficiency of all classroom instructors at each campus under the jurisdiction, governance or supervision of the Board.”

University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign campus’ Other Academic Hiring Policies, Procedures and Programs state that “before hiring, unit executive officers must certify that non-native English speaking instructors (e.g., assistant professor, associate professor, professor; teaching, research or clinical professor (assistant, associate, full); instructor; senior instructor; lecturer; senior lecturer; or teaching, research or clinical associate, whether visiting or not) are orally proficient in English. Oral English proficiency can be determined in a number of ways, e.g., formal interviews, assessment of candidates by colleagues within the academic unit, and/or public presentations.”

University of Illinois Springfield campus faculty policy on oral English proficiency states that “an assessment of the effectiveness of the use of oral English is made during the process of hiring new faculty by asking those who participate in the interviews (faculty, staff and students), to assess the candidates’ communication skills.”

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In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated that: (a) because of the long hiring process for faculty positions at the Urbana-Champaign campus, the list of “new hires” provided to the auditors captured individuals whose start dates were in FY15 (July 2014 through June 2015) but for whom the hiring paperwork was done in FY14. Specifically, the paperwork to hire the six (6) individuals for whom no oral English proficiency certification exists was processed from February through May 2014. Changes to the Urbana-Champaign campus main hiring form (the Summary Form) were made in July 2014. 100% of the randomly selected faculty whose paperwork was processed after July 1, 2014 had oral English proficiency certifications completed; and (b) the Springfield campus policy in place at the time of audit required that initial oral English proficiency assessments be administered during the first three weeks of the semester rather than prior to providing any classroom instruction.

Failure to collect campus-level documentation of the certification of oral English language proficiency of non-native English speaking tenure-system faculty and “other academic” staff members results in noncompliance with University’s policies and the Act. (Finding Code No. 2015-026, 2014-035, 2013-021)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University review its process and consider any changes necessary to ensure oral English language proficiency assessments and certifications are completed in accordance with University policies.

University Response:

Accepted. Corrective action was taken in FY15 for UIUC. At UIS, updated policy was recently approved and implementation is underway.

2015-027. Finding: Inadequate Controls over Property and Equipment

The University did not fully comply with requirements applicable to its property and equipment.

We reviewed the University's property inventory certification as of June 30, 2015 that was submitted to the Department of Central Management Services (DCMS). The inventory certification to DCMS reported 124 items (\$232,500 out of the total population of \$2,207,453,166) of equipment that could not be located by the University. These assets were acquired by the University during the current as well as past fiscal years. Included in the equipment that was reported as "unlocated" were approximately 81 computers, servers, CPUs, or other electronic storage devices.

In addition, we tested a sample of 50 equipment items to determine whether equipment was in the correct location and was properly recorded in the University's property records. As a result of our testing, we noted the following:

- One equipment item (totaling \$63,850) under the Chicago campus could not be located and was subsequently removed from the University's property records;
- Two equipment items (totaling \$258,154) under the Chicago campus were at sites other than the location listed on the University's property records; and
- One equipment item (totaling \$36,250) under the Chicago campus was considered obsolete by the user department, but was still listed on the University's property records.

Also, during our test work over 67 procurement card transactions totaling \$247,947, we noted a transaction (totaling \$2,379) for the purchase of equipment that was not tagged in accordance with the University's policies and procedures.

The State Property Control Act (30 ILCS 605/4) requires responsible officers at each State Agency to be accountable for supervision, control and inventory of property under their jurisdiction to ensure proper accounting and safeguarding of assets.

The Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (30 ILCS 10/3001) requires the University to establish and maintain a system or systems of internal fiscal and administrative controls, which shall provide assurance that: (1) resources are utilized effectively, and in compliance with applicable law; (2) obligations and costs are in compliance with applicable law; (3) funds, property and other assets and resources are safeguarded against waste, loss, unauthorized use, and misappropriation; (4) revenues, expenditures, and transfers of assets, resources or funds applicable to operations are properly recorded and accounted for to permit preparation of accounts and reliable financial and statistical reports and to maintain accountability over the State's resources; and (5) funds held outside the State Treasury are managed, used, and obtained in strict accordance with the terms of their enabling authorities and that no unauthorized funds exist. The University's system of internal controls should include procedures to ensure all State property are safeguarded, properly recorded, and that obsolete equipment is removed from the property records.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated that the underlying cause of the audit exceptions varies by situations as follows:

- For the one equipment item not located, the unit failed to follow standard procedures thoroughly as the item had been replaced with newer equipment, but never removed from the unit's tracked inventory when taken out of service;

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- For the two equipment items with incorrect location codes, these had been moved to protect the items due to flooding, and when the items were permanently moved to the new locations, the unit failed to follow standard procedure and update location codes for moved items; and
- For the equipment item considered obsolete, the unit had removed the server component just days before the audit observation and the item was still being held as a “back-up” in the data center until the new equipment was tested and operational for a reasonable time.

Additionally, the University stated that the “unlocated” items result from different situations. A common scenario includes items physically moved within a unit, without the person moving the equipment notifying the unit’s property contact, resulting in the unit having difficulty finding the item at inventory time. Such items can later be located and identified as found in a subsequent inventory. Another common scenario that can occur is when a unit scraps an inoperable/unrepairable piece of equipment without following standard procedures.

For the exception related to the untagged equipment item, they indicated that the exception was due to human error.

The significant volume of “unlocated” equipment demonstrates a lack of accountability. Failure to maintain accurate property records could result in inaccurate accounting records and could cause unnecessary equipment expenditures. (Finding Code No. 2015-027)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University management review its process for ensuring that all equipment records are accurately maintained and updated in a timely manner. We also recommend the University strengthen its internal control over the accountability of University equipment.

University Response:

Accepted. With a large inventory of equipment inventory spanning three campuses, some equipment items can be challenging to locate, for the reasons discussed in this finding. Nevertheless, the University will continue to take the necessary corrective actions to further improve in this area.

CURRENT FINDINGS – STATE COMPLIANCE
Year Ended June 30, 2015**

2015-028. Finding: Lack of Formal Written Policy on Maintenance of University Vehicles

The University did not have a formal written policy in place regarding regular maintenance of University vehicles.

During our testwork over 25 University vehicles, we noted that the University did not have a formal written policy in relation to regular maintenance (such as oil change and tire rotation) of University vehicles. As a result, we noted that regular vehicle maintenance was not performed on one vehicle sampled from the Chicago campus during the fiscal year. We verified that the department assigned with the vehicle did not submit odometer readings during the fiscal year to the Chicago campus' Transportation Facility Department; hence, the vehicle was not flagged as due for maintenance. The last maintenance performed on the vehicle was on April 6, 2014.

The Illinois Administrative Code (44 Ill. Admin. Code 5040.400) states that all State-owned vehicles shall undergo regular service in order to maintain the vehicles in road worthy, safe, operating condition and appropriate cosmetic condition. In addition, the Fiscal Control and Internal Auditing Act (30 ILCS 10/3001) requires the University to establish and maintain a system or systems of fiscal and administrative controls to provide assurance that State resources are utilized efficiently and effectively. Effective internal control should include a policy to ensure that University vehicles receive regular maintenance.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated that they were not aware of the requirement for a formal written policy.

Failure to adopt a formal written policy and monitoring process for maintaining University vehicles could result in University vehicles not receiving regular maintenance, thereby potentially decreasing performance, safety, and useful lives. (Finding Code No. 2015-028)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University establish a formal written policy on regular maintenance of University vehicles across campuses. We also recommend the University ensure that the policy is clearly understood and followed by all responsible employees.

University Response:

Accepted. The University will take the necessary corrective action to address the recommendation in this finding.

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CURRENT FINDINGS – STATE COMPLIANCE
Year Ended June 30, 2015**

2015-029. Finding: Noncompliance with the Campus Security Enhancement Act

The University did not comply with the Campus Security Enhancement Act (Act) requirements in reporting arrest information.

During our review of 25 arrest reports to test the University's compliance with the Act, we noted seven arrest reports (one from the Urbana-Champaign campus and six from the Chicago campus) were not made available to the news media for inspection and copying as required. Specifically, four of the seven arrest reports were made available 1 to 5 days late and three arrest reports were not made available at all.

The Campus Security Enhancement Act (110 ILCS 12/15) requires that when an individual is arrested, certain information must be made available to the news media for inspection and copying as soon as practicable, but in no event shall the time period exceed 72 hours from the arrest.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated that the Chicago campus provided arrest information to the news media upon request and through weekly publication in the University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC) News and on the UIC News website. However, they did not keep a log of arrest information during FY 2014. At the Urbana-Champaign campus, the noted offender was never taken into custody but given a summons to appear in court. They discovered that the records management system, used to generate the media arrest log, did not capture the information regarding this incident.

Failure to provide the arrest information to the news media in a timely manner results in noncompliance with the Act. (Finding Code No. 2015-029)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University review its current process and consider required changes to ensure that arrest information is made available timely in accordance with the requirements of the Act.

University Response:

Accepted. The records management system used at the Urbana-Champaign campus was updated to prevent this from happening in the future. The Chicago campus will implement a continuous arrest log which will be available to the media in a timely manner.

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CURRENT FINDINGS – STATE COMPLIANCE
Year Ended June 30, 2015**

2015-030. Finding: Noncompliance with State Employee Housing Act and Related University Policies and Procedures

The University did not comply with the State Employee Housing Act and related University policies and procedures.

During our testwork over 25 employees provided with University housing, we noted the following:

- Three employees from the Chicago campus did not have supporting application forms.
- One Urbana-Champaign campus employee's personnel records did not indicate that employee's residence is a condition of employment.

The State Employee Housing Act (Act) (5 ILCS 412/5-30) states that the University of Illinois shall develop and maintain application forms for its State-owned housing, written criteria for selecting employee tenants, and records of decisions as to who was selected to receive State housing and why they were selected.

In addition, the University policies and procedures state that if an employee occupies University-owned housing as a condition of employment, this must be clearly stated on the employee's personnel records.

In discussing these conditions with University officials, they stated that: (a) for the Chicago campus, the Faculty in Residence (FIR) program requires residency as a component of the program and therefore a separate housing application is not required. Due to staff leadership turnover the FIR program offer letter information regarding the sampled individuals was not located in a timely manner; and (b) for the Urbana-Champaign campus, the University posting for search to hire employee noted as exception included information regarding this being a live-in position. However, the offer letter and signed job description failed to mention the live-in requirement of this position.

Failure to maintain copies of application forms of employees provided with University housing results in noncompliance with the Act. In addition, failure to follow the University's policies related to housing provided to employees as a condition of employment results in noncompliance with the University policies and procedures. (Finding Code No. 2015-030)

Recommendation:

We recommend the University review its current process related to employee occupied University housing and consider required changes to ensure that application forms are properly maintained as required by the Act, and personnel records are completed in accordance with University policies and procedures.

University Response:

Accepted. The University will take the necessary corrective actions to address the recommendations in this finding.

Year Ended June 30, 2015**

A. Finding: Inadequate Procedures over Financial Reporting of Investment Activity

The University has not established adequate procedures to reconcile investment sales and purchases, as reported within its statement of cash flows, to appropriate source detail. (Finding Code No. 2014-003)

During the current year engagement, the auditors noted the University improved its investment reconciliation process to provide appropriate source detail to ensure the accuracy of the amounts reported within its financial statements.

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PRIOR FINDINGS NOT REPEATED – FEDERAL COMPLIANCE
Year Ended June 30, 2015**

B. Finding: Expenditures Reported in the Incorrect Accounting Period

The University reported expenditures under Research and Development, Highway Planning and Construction Cluster, Education and Human Resource, and Head Start programs in the incorrect accounting period. (Finding Code No. 2014-007)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the samples selected. The University SEFA is now being prepared under the modified cash basis of accounting.

C. Finding: Inadequate Documentation for Payroll and Fringe Benefit Expenditures

The University did not obtain proper documentation, including time and effort certification, to support time charged to a federal project. (Finding Code No. 2014-008, 2013-008)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the samples selected.

D. Finding: Inadequate Process for Updating Property Management Records

The University did not consistently follow property management regulations relative to equipment purchased with federal funding from the Research and Development Cluster and Cooperative Extension Services programs. (Finding Code No. 2014-009, 2013-009, 12-12, 11-22, 10-26, 09-24)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the samples selected.

E. Finding: Improper Reconciliation of Borrower Data

The University did not maintain and document accurate reconciliations of Direct Loan amounts. (Finding Code No. 2014-013)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the samples selected.

F. Finding: Improper Subsidized Federal Direct Loan Amount

The University disbursed subsidized Federal Direct loans in excess of eligible amounts. (Finding Code No. 2014-014)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the samples selected.

G. Finding: Failure to Timely and Accurately Report Student Status Changes

The University did not submit changes in the enrollment status of borrowers under the Federal Direct Loan program within required time frames. (Finding Code No. 2014-015)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the samples selected.

H. Finding: Improper Indirect Cost Rate

The University did not use the proper indirect cost rate for all Research and Development Cluster program awards. (Finding Code No. 2014-016)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the samples selected.

Year Ended June 30, 2015**

I. Finding: Inadequate Monitoring of Subrecipient OMB Circular A-133 Audit Reports

The University is not adequately documenting reviews of OMB Circular A-133 audit reports. (Finding Code No. 2014-017)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the samples selected.

J. Finding: Failure to Report Subaward Information Required by FFATA

The University did not report information required by the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act (FFATA) for awards granted to subrecipients of the Research and Development Cluster program. (Finding Code No. 2014-019)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the samples selected.

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PRIOR FINDINGS NOT REPEATED – STATE COMPLIANCE
Year Ended June 30, 2015**

K. Finding: Pre-employment References not documented in Accordance with University Policies and Procedures

The University does not have adequate procedures in place to ensure that pre-employment references are appropriately documented and maintained in accordance with University policies and procedures. (Finding Code No. 2014-025)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the samples selected.

L. Finding: Inadequate Procedures to Appropriately Identify and Record Capital Expenditures in a Timely Manner

The University has not established adequate procedures to appropriately identify and record capital expenditures in a timely manner. (Finding Code No. 2014-027)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified in the samples selected.

M. Finding: Statutory Mandates – County Cooperative Extension Law

The University did not fully comply with the County Cooperative Extension Law (Law). (Finding Code No. 2014-030, 2013-026, 12-30)

In the current year, the University sought legislative amendment (Illinois Senate Bill 813) on requirements of the Law, and that was approved by the Governor in July 2015.

N. Finding: Noncompliance with the Illinois Vehicle Code

The University did not timely obtain license and automotive liability coverage certifications from employees assigned a State-owned vehicle. (Finding Code No. 2014-032)

In the current year, the University obtained certifications of licensure and automotive liability coverage for all employees assigned State-owned vehicles.

O. Finding: Uncollateralized Deposit Account

The University has not established adequate internal controls to ensure sufficient collateral is obtained to secure public funds held at a bank or savings and loan association where those funds are not covered by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). (Finding Code No. 2014-036)

In the current year, our testing results indicated the University established adequate internal controls to ensure sufficient collateral was obtained.

P. Finding: Inadequate Review of an Accounting Adjustment Made at Period End

The University did not adequately review an accounting adjustment made to financial records at period end as part of the financial reporting process. (Finding Code No. 2014-038)

In the current year, similar exceptions were not identified during the review of accounting adjustments made at period end by the University.

PRIOR FINDINGS NOT REPEATED – STATE COMPLIANCE
Year Ended June 30, 2015**

Q. Finding: Performance Audit Follow-Up

In January 2012, the Office of the Auditor General released a performance audit of the University of Illinois (University) which contained 20 recommendations to improve the performance and operations of the University. As of June 30, 2014, there were five recommendations that were either partially implemented or could not be tested in 2014. (Finding Code No. 2014-039, 2013-028)

During the current year, we noted the University improved in implementing the recommendations, and the exceptions identified were reported in the immaterial finding letter as finding number IM2015-013.

R. Finding: Inadequate Controls over User Access to Information Systems

The University did not establish adequate internal controls over access to information systems used in its financial reporting process. (Finding Code No. 2014-024, 2013-017, 12-20, 11-02, 10-01, 09-01, 08-05)

Even though improvements were made, we still identified exceptions regarding delays in locking down the user accounts of terminated users. As a result, this finding is reported in the current examination in the letter of immaterial findings as finding code IM2015-014.

S. Finding: Noncompliance with University Guidelines of the Illinois Legislative Audit Commission

The University did not adhere to the University Guidelines (1982) of the Illinois Legislative Audit Commission (LAC). (Finding Code No. 2014-026)

During the current year, our testing results indicated that the University did not have subsidies between accounting entities and was in compliance with the University Guidelines.

T. Finding: Inadequate Procedures to Remove Inactive Employees from Payroll System

The University has not established adequate procedures to identify and remove inactive hourly employees from the payroll system in a timely manner. (Finding Code No. 2014-034, 2013-015, 12-17)

During the current year, we noted the University improved in implementing the recommendations, and the exceptions identified were reported in the immaterial finding letter as finding number IM2015-012.

U. Finding: Improper Classification and Approval of General Ledger Expenditures

The University did not properly code and classify certain expenditures from vendor payments in the general ledger system, and has not established adequate controls to ensure that proper approvals were obtained prior to payment of vendor's invoice. (Finding Code No. 2014-037, 2013-022, 12-24)

During the current year, we noted the University improved in implementing the recommendations, and the exceptions identified were reported in the immaterial finding letter as finding number IM2015-007.

Note 1. Basis of Presentation

The accompanying Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards (the "Schedule") includes the federal award activity of the University of Illinois (University) under programs of the federal government for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2015. The information in this Schedule is presented in accordance with the requirements of OMB Circular A-133, *Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations* and Title 2 U.S. Code of Federal Regulations Part 200, *Uniform Administrative Requirement, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards* ("Uniform Guidance").

The schedule designates federal awards as direct and pass-through. Direct awards represent federal funding awarded directly to the University by a federal agency, pass-through awards are federal awards passed through a non-federal entity. Pass-through identifying information is presented when available and when applicable.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Expenditures reported on the Schedule are presented on a modified cash basis of accounting. The methodology for determining federal awards expended is:

Direct costs are reported as federal expenditures on a cash basis, with the following exceptions:

1. Academic Year (nine-month) faculty salaries charged to sponsored projects are earned over nine months and paid over twelve months.
2. Salaries and wages earned between the last payroll date in June and June 30 are accrued and included as a current year federal expenditure.
3. Payroll related fringe benefits costs that are charged on an actuarial basis are included as a current year federal expenditure.

Indirect costs are assessed as a percentage of direct costs and are included as a current year federal expenditure.

Expenditures reported on the Schedule meet the cost principles contained in OMB Circular A-21, *Cost Principles for Educational Institutions*, and/or in the Uniform Guidance, wherein certain types of expenditures are not allowable or are limited as to reimbursement. Negative amounts shown on the Schedule represent adjustments or credits made in the normal course of business to amounts reported as expenditures in prior years.

Note 3. Federal Student Loan Programs

As disclosed in the non-cash federal awards section of the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards, the Federal Direct Student Loans Program (CFDA 84.268) administered by the University awarded approximately \$208.9 million at the Urbana Campus, \$233.7 million at the Chicago Campus, and \$22 million at the Springfield Campus.

In addition, the University administers a series of loan programs as part of the Student Financial Assistance Cluster program. Loan balances subject to continuing compliance requirements during the year ended June 30, 2015 under the Federal Perkins Loan Program (Perkins), Health Professional Student Loans (HPSL), Loans for Disadvantaged Students (LDS), Nursing Student Loan Program (Nursing), and Nursing Faculty Loan Program (NFLP) programs were as follows:

Note 4. Non-Cash Federal Assistance

The University of Illinois received a pass-through grant from Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS) to review the applications of families seeking subsidized day care under the Temporary Assistance Needy Families cluster, the Child Care Development Funds cluster, and the Social Service Block Grant programs. The applications were reviewed according to guidelines set by IDHS, who was the prime recipient of the federal funds.

As a result of the University's application review, the Illinois State Comptroller distributed \$8,263,034 of federal funds to day care providers as follows:
